Our Client's are Employed!

Transitional Housing Pilot

Jamillah and children: Kyren – 2, Nehri – 1

Jamillah is our **first candidate for the pilot Transitional Housing Program**. While in the emergency shelter program, Jamillah had been connected with Parent's as Teachers for parental education and BJC for mental health. Jamillah has accepted an offer from Spectrum in St. Ann as a MAC Coordinator. She will begin her 4 week training starting November 15th. She will earn \$15.00 per/hr. She has been able to successfully enroll her children at Jump Start Learning Center in Bridgeton for her childcare needs. Outside of permanent housing (currently Jamillah is in transitional housing until the end of this year), Jamillah's greatest need is **transportation**. To get to work on time, Jamillah must travel nearly two hours on the bus and walk 20 minutes from the bus stop to her childcare provider with her small children, ages 1 and 2. Once she secures her children at the childcare provider, she must then walk the same 20 minutes back to the bus stop to get to work. She must then repeat this route when she gets off from work. While she is in training her work hours will be from 9 a.m.-6 p.m. She will have this schedule for the next four weeks, after which she will work from 2 p.m. -11 p.m. at night. Having a vehicle would provide Jamillah with the leg up she needs for continued success and stability.

Full Time Employment

Kenyatta and children: Royal – 3, Razik – 1 Christina and children: Diamond – 16, Christian – 9 Kenyatta and Christina are both working full time at Strawberry's Day Care. Room at the Inn is providing transportation to the day care each morning and picking the clients up each afternoon. Volunteers and staff are working together to make this happen. The clients work from 9 am – 4 pm. It has been a great way for them to save money prior to a housing placement. Christina's children are in school while she works. Kenyatta's children are allowed to attend the day care she is employed at. We are thankful for this opportunity for our clients and are trying our best to provide transportation since there is not a bus route to this day care.

Deitrice has Housing!

Deitrice, along with her son Justice, has been approved this week to move into an apartment.
