

A New Adventure!

*This is a day of new beginnings, time to remember and move on, time to believe what love is bringing, laying to rest the pain that's gone.

Most people consider January 1st the beginning of the new year where all things are fresh and new. Time to hang up the new calendar, to fresh, to zero the counters and see where we can go from here.

Now is not the time to get started, because our adventure with Jesus has already begun. But it is a time to evaluate, get fresh perspective, and seek new possibilities...and then to begin again. To risk, to pray, to stretch, to grow. Now is a time to be readying ourselves to carry on Christ's ministry on earth.

Then let us, with the Spirit's daring, Step from the past and leave behind Our disappointment, guilt, and grieving, Seeking new paths, and sure to find.

Look behind you...what have you been doing this past year that used your gifts and talents to help Christ love people? Now look ahead...what can you do that you have never done before (with that ministry or a new one) that will reach someone new, or in a new way? What do you need to know? Who do you need to talk to? What extra resources will you need? Who might join you in your adventure? Now is a good time for all of us to assess what we're doing, and figure out how we can do better, smarter, with greater love, and to invite others to join us.

Christ is alive, and goes before us To show and share what love can do. This is a day of new beginnings, Our God is making all things new!

It is an exciting time. God is with us! This is the time to begin new adventures. I look forward to hearing about yours.

Human Relations Sunday is January 19, 2020

Sunday, January 19th is Human Relations Day, the first of the six special collection Sundays across United Methodist Churches. It is celebrated on the Sunday before Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's birthday. On this day we join other United Methodist congregations to collectively support neighborhood ministries. This offering was originally established in 1972 to fund "Self-Determination Projects," "The Black Community Developers," and "The Police-Community Relations Program." Then, in the 1980's it was designated to support ministries of social justice and outreach to at-risk youth.
