


New Director of Children's Ministries!

Dear Church,

By now, many of you have read or heard about the recently released "Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation for the United Methodist Church". It hit the internet last Friday, was included on the front page of the Saturday Post-Dispatch, and drew a response by our Missouri Bishop Robert Farr.

Before offering Bishop Farr's statement here in its entirety, I would like to remind us all that it is a proposal, meaning it has yet to be voted upon by General Conference, the only body in our denomination that can change the rules by which we are organized. There are a number of other plans that have been submitted as well, but this one has a definite edge because of the circle of its designers.


The 16-member mediation team included, at one end of the theological spectrum, the leader of the Wesley Covenant Association, the lead group lobbying for traditional values relating to human sexuality. At the other end of that spectrum was the Executive Director of the Reconciling Ministry Network, who has been leading the movement for full inclusion. It was purportedly a balanced group of UMC Bishops and other leaders that included traditionalist, centrist, and progressive points of view.

For me, it is important to keep in mind this one main thing: no matter how our connection changes over time, WUM is a church family, and we are dedicated to love, grow, and serve in the name of Jesus Christ. As a family, (which also undergoes changes over time btw) we will continue to love each other, grow in God's grace, and serve one another and our neighbor. That is who we are.

I hope you will take the time to read our Bishop's statement. It summarizes the salient points of the plan, and illuminates how it might unfold here in our own Conference should it be approved at GC 2020.

Missouri Statement on Protocol of Separation (following on page 4)





Dear Colleagues in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of Christ Jesus. I write to call your attention to the results of a mediation process undertaken by 16 United Methodists, entitled "A Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation."

This is the first true agreement I've seen across multiple plan leaders and special interest groups. For that reason alone, I'm taking it seriously. I am hopeful this may be a pathway forward for The United Methodist Church that helps people honor their convictions and relate to their mission fields.

This protocol is offered in service to the delegates who will gather in four months in Minneapolis for the 2020 General Conference. **General Conference remains the only body that can set official policy and speak for the denomination**. Ultimately, it will be up to the delegates at the 2020 General Conference in Minneapolis in May. As the Missouri Conference, we will do our best to enact legislation passed by the General Conference. If this were to pass, there would be a post-separation General Conference in order to re-organize The United Methodist Church. The process and timeline for implementation would not begin until 2021 and would not be complete until 2024. Key takeaways of the proposal include:

- No annual conference or local church is required to vote on departure from the UMC.
- No one is being asked to leave or separate from the Church.
- Annual conferences and local churches are being given a pathway to leave for a new expressions of the Methodist Church. In this scenario, they may keep their assets and property.
- Wespath, our pension agency, will offer a continuity of service across any post-separation Methodists denominations.
- The UMC, under the cross and flame, will continue in ministry across the world as will the Missouri Annual Conference. It may look different than it does today but it will be here.

As you can imagine, Missouri's General Conference delegation and the Pathways Taskforce will explore and learn more about this new development as we move toward May and our own annual conference. 
Invite a friend to join you for some of the fun. Your contribution is just \$5 that will cover the 3 hours of tubing and lunch.


