



#### **Church from Home**

#### Dear Church,

Since last I wrote you, things have changed even more at the church and in our communities. We have now disbanded our worship teams and Pastor Josh will be Facebook live-streaming The Mountain Service from his dining room on Thursday evenings at 7:30p. I will be Facebook livestreaming Sunday Worship at 10:30am from my kitchen table, or maybe my backyard deck (depending on the weather). It's going to be weird, but wonderful too. I hope you can join us.

Not everyone has Facebook connections, so starting this week I will be mailing out my sermons and prayers to those folks who already receive a printed newsletter.

I want to thank those who have taken the time to mail in your offerings and tithes. The church continues to make payroll and pay our bills on time. I am deeply grateful that we are financially in a position to continue to pay our staff, both hourly and salaried, during this time of confinement. Certainly not all churches have been able to do that. On my own and their behalf, I say thank you.

Let me give you a peek into what Holy Week (next week!) is going to look like. We will celebrate worship on Palm Sunday, 4/5, at 10:30am, livestreaming to Facebook. During the week, there will be opportunities for you and our immediate neighborhood to take part in activities located outside of our church building. I hope to chalk a prayer labyrinth on the parking lot when I know there will be a few dry days in a row. People will be invited to take a fan palm, some bubbles, a special rock, or hang an ornament on the Ted Hoyer tree.

Josh will host Maundy Thursday/Service of Darkness on Thursday evening at 7:30pm, again live-streaming to Facebook. Have your own candles lit wherever you are worshipping.

On Good Friday, I will place the cross on our church lawn with the black cloth hanging from it, blowing in the breeze, and replace that cloth on Easter Sunday with the pure white fabric, celebrating Christ's Resurrection.

There will be an avalanche of pinwheels in the church lawn that morning, with the invitation to take one to your own yard. I will celebrate Easter worship, live-

streaming to Facebook, at 10:30am, and encourage you to have an unlit candle there with you on a nearby table. We'll light our candles together during worship. I hope later you will take a Sunday drive past Webster United Methodist, and choose your pinwheel.

Friends, for the mission of the church, the silver lining in this dark cloud of separation that we're enduring, is that it offers a magnificent opportunity to include our walking neighbors in some new and ancient Holy Week rituals and Easter Celebrations. Please join me in praying that all the folks (and dogs) streaming past our church every day will feel the love of Christ.

# Kristen Kremer's Meal Train is still on track, and you don't have to cook!

Friends, Kristen and her family are still needing meals in April and May while she continues receiving treatments. If you are able to purchase gift cards for meal providers that deliver (like Panera Bread and Domino's Pizza), you can leave them in the cooler we've been using for her meals that is tied to her front porch. If you prefer to cook, that is wonderful.

Whether you're cooking or providing gift cards, go to <u>signupgenius.com</u> and click on the magnifying glass in the upper right hand corner. The next screen will have a search box, so type in "<u>pastorsharon@wumc.org</u>". That will bring up a screen where you look for the words "meal train for Kristen", under the photo of the hands holding the dish. Click on that phrase and the site will take you to the signup list. The dates listed are Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays. After you click on the date you want, the site will guide you.

Our church is providing 2 meals a week, so don't choose a Wednesday if Monday and Friday are already taken. Also, and apologies for this, Fridays mean Thursdays; Kristen realized her kids are not always all with her over every weekend.

Please feel free to email Linda Shantz with any questions. She will coordinate between you and Kristen to be sure she needs the meal on the date you've chosen. And, many thanks for helping her and her family weather this storm!



### **UMCOR Sunday on March 29**

We observed the special offering **UMCOR Sunday** on March 29<sup>th</sup> this year, but it is not too late to give, if you have not yet had a chance to do so. The COVID-19 pandemic has necessitated restrictions on group gatherings, and so our connections online are important to use. The good news is that our website has a place to electronically GIVE, including for special offerings such as **UMCOR**, (the **United Methodist Committee on Relief).** Of course, you can also mail a check to the church, but <u>if you want to pay online using credit or debit card, do the</u> following:

- 1) go to www.websterunitedmethodist.org
- 2) find the links listed at the top of the page such as "Home," "Welcome," etc., and click on the link that says "GIVE," which goes to the "Give" page.
- 3) Next, click on "Give Now," and this will go to our Online Giving Page which will process the donation. (You will see a picture of UM Committee on Relief fund at that site). Follow the directions to complete.

The Methodist Church of Puerto Rico is dealing with recent series of more than 500 earthquakes in December and January, through its own disaster-response organization and through partnership with the **United Methodist Committee on Relief**. **UMCOR** awarded them a solidarity grant to help with immediate needs.

Please be generous when you select that **GIVE** button and proceed to select **"UM Committee on Relief"** on the Online Giving Page. Your gifts through the **UMCOR Sunday** offering will help to ensure that **UMCOR** can respond wherever and whenever a disaster occurs.



#### LifeWise Food Pantry! March is our month to fill the shelves!

Granted, we have moved past March and have begun the month of April (already!) but there is still a great need at LifeWise.

COVID-19 is adversely impacting all of us one way or another, but **some of the hardest hit are those we serve** at LifeWise StL. Families are not able to go to work because their kids are home from school, while others are losing their jobs outright. Families will have a difficult time having their basic needs met. However, LifeWise is open, and WUM can help.

#### How is LifeWise helping?

- LifeWise is distributing food and household supplies to the community during our normal market shopping hours through a drive-up line in front of our building to ensure families do not go hungry as their income is impacted.
- We are enabling families to keep working by providing childcare.
- Our social workers and other staff are doing daily mental health check-ins with our youth and adult participants via Facebook Live and phone calls.
- We have created an online check-in where moms can complete an anxiety/depression inventory and request that diapers, books and kid activities be delivered to their home.
- We are checking in on our immigrant participants specifically because they are more isolated, and we will take them supplies as needed.

Thanks to their dedicated staff, last week LifeWise served 600 people with 400 bags of most needed food items at a cost of \$6,800. This was as much

as we usually spend in one month! We expect the number of served to grow as jobs are impacted.

Kay and Deane Looney loaded up a carload of food products last week that had been brought to our church for delivery to LifeWise. Staff was extremely grateful for our support in their time of need. Their food pantry stocks had been seriously depleted and the food was enthusiastically received.

I know that it's very difficult to assemble food stuffs during this virus challenge. But if you are somehow able to bring food products to the church, The Looney's are happily willing to take them down to LifeWise. They need our help.
