


We also will continue to worship together through Facebook on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm and on Sunday mornings at 10:30am.

The September 25 gathering is a proactive community-wide response to take ownership of improving equity in Webster Groves: learning about what work is underway in Webster Groves; how regular people can find their place in influencing further change; ending with a half hour vigil along Lockwood.

Special WUM Offering for US Weather Disasters

The news is bad for people, trees, and wildlife in Oregon and California. Wildfires are sweeping out of control through thousands and thousands of acres of forest, consuming the homes of all living things. The skies are grey with smoke. But the United Methodist Committee on Relief has already begun to respond.

Last month, Hurricane Laura ravaged coastal communities in the path of the storm's heavy winds and rain in Louisiana and Texas. Even as I type this, Hurricane Sally is smashing into the coasts of Florida and Alabama. UMCOR will be there too, guiding the initial assessments, forming Emergency Response Teams, and coordinating delivery of supplies and PPE.

Relief efforts for the widespread damage caused by the mighty high-wind storm, or "derecho," in Iowa and Illinois have been organized by UMCOR-trained conference disaster response coordinators. Emergency response teams have been deployed and UMCOR is in communication with the impacted conferences. A solidarity grant has been awarded to the Iowa Conference.

UMCOR and its partners are responding to disasters in the United States every day, providing funding to meet immediate needs and continuing to work with conferences in the days and months to come. We write to you today to share that our long-time Executive Director Ed Johnson announced his retirement at our September Board of Directors meeting. We are grateful for Ed's faithful service and his commitment. He has made our community more compassionate and secure for many people.

From the turbulent times of the Great Recession to a global pandemic, Ed has rooted his leadership in faith and been committed to serving the needs of those encountering challenges in their lives. Throughout his 13-year tenure, he has been a hands-on leader. You were as likely to find him hauling food pantry donations as speaking to a congregation about the programs of WRHM. Our office volunteers are devoted to him for his support of their work and his fellowship. UNAFRAID, Living with Courage and Hope in Uncertain Times, by Adam Hamilton

Epworth Children and Family Services - Food Pantry

As many of you know Epworth serves children, youth and families in the St. Louis area and is associated with the United Methodist Church as one of our National Mission Institutes. The population they serve includes youth in our community who are homeless or at risk and the agency does so in a variety of ways including residential housing, emergency shelters, and outreach to homeless youth.

Epworth continues to be very grateful for our church's financial donations, meals, and other items given so that they can feed and care for their clients. Something that was expanded because of the pandemic and at the request of the NAACP was the food pantry at the Normandy location. Previously, it provided food for the youth who came to the Drop-In Center but the needs in the community have become so great that the expansion was very important. They are in need of any of the typical pantry items such as canned fruits and vegetables, cereals, canned meats or other protein items, pasta or rice type food, etc. Another need is bottled water.

Young Adult Ministries (YAMs) Update:

From Pastor Josh, Director of Young Adult Ministries

Hello Church! I would like to start to update you all on what the YAMs have been doing in these past couples of months. Ever since October of 2018, we have been providing ministry to folks aged 18-35. Since then, the Holy Spirit has moved in ways that are absolutely unexplainable. I am happy to say that we are now been told by NextGen ministries through the Missouri Annual Conference that Webster UM YAMs is the second-largest young adult ministry in the state of Missouri!

I have been continually blessed with a great team of leaders that are named "CALL". This group has been meeting to create and design different ministry opportunities for every type of Young Adult. Since the pandemic has started, YAMs have just increased our ministries offering online and hybrid-based small groups.

Since the Covid-19 Pandemic has started, the Young Adults have created 15 new ministries, having at least 40 different Young Adults participating and we recently

opened some of our small groups up to the whole church. We were able to provide small groups for 25 other community members who fell outside of our 18-35 age range.

I am going to continue to provide updates for you all on a regular basis and also update you on the classes that are available to you all. I think now more than ever it is so important for us to stay in community, and you can do that through a YAM small group! Please email me if you have any questions!
