...a message from Pastor Sharon

"I will praise you, Lord my God, with all my heart; I will glorify your name forever!" Psalm 86:12

We are called Methodists for a reason.

The term has its roots in eighteenth century Anglicanism. Its founder was a Church of England minister, John Wesley (1703-1791), who sought to challenge the religious assumptions of the day. During his time studying at Oxford, he and others met regularly for Bible study and prayer, to receive communion and do acts of charity. They became known as 'The Holy Club' or 'Methodists' because of the methodical way in which they carried out their Christian faith. It was meant to be a jab, not a compliment. But John Wesley later adopted the term 'Methodist' himself to mean the methodical pursuit of biblical holiness. It is through daily and weekly practice that we praise the Lord our God with all our heart!

As part of our discipleship, each year we recommit ourselves to the five pillars of a faithful community: our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. And so it is now that time of year when we ask our faith family (members and those who feel like this is their church) to prayerfully consider how you are living out your faith, and how you plan to grow it next year.



It is by these means of support, (our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness), that the church, the Body of Christ, can fully function. After all, if there's one thing we have learned this year, it is that YOU are the church, not the bricks and mortar of the building. Without YOU, we cannot BE the church.

The most wonderful news is how you have been incredibly generous in sending in your

financial pledges since March, when we became physically separated from one another. Thank you so much for your faithfulness! Because of you, we have been able to continue to support the children, youth, young adults and families whom we are called to love in the name of Christ, and we have not had to lay off any of our staff.

So we are asking, if you are able, to recommit to your 2020 pledge for yet another year, through 2021. We are also adjusting the Presence commitment to include one of four different ways to "be present" with one another.

Because of the weirdness of this very strange year, we will be carrying out our stewardship program entirely by mail, or walk in/drop off into Pastor Sharon's basket. Soon you will receive your commitment cards, and I ask you to pray about it, and then fill it out and return it to the church in the self-stamped and addressed envelope by November 1st, All Saints Sunday. We are working on planning a safe celebration for that day, and will share the details soon.

This has been an extraordinary year, my friends. But you are extraordinary people.

Pray for Election Day 2020

Lay pastor Ivan James has been watching with concern the national dialogue as the country nears the November 3 election. Deepening political divisions in America and the fear that votes won't get counted have eroded civil discourse. Pastor James felt he had no other choice than to turn to God and begin a period of intense prayer leading up the election. Leaning on the




connectional nature of The United Methodist Church, Pastor James began to invite all United Methodists in Missouri to pray daily in the 30 days leading up to the presidential election. One of his calls was to Bishop Bob Farr who accepted the challenge.

"It is part of the pastoral duty to pray for our leaders and all those who govern," said Bishop Farr. "I've accepted Pastor Ivan James' invitation to pray daily in the month leading up to our nation's election and I invite you to join our efforts to invite the Holy Spirit to work in and among us as we move toward a free and fair election."

While those who follow Jesus understand that their allegiance to God takes precedence over our allegiance to any state, United Methodists also acknowledge the vital function of government as a principal vehicle for the ordering of society. For more on what United Methodists believe about the Political Community, see ¶164 in The Book of Discipline 2016 (p. 138-142). In 1774, Methodism's founder John Wesley offered powerful advice regarding a Christian's role in voting: 1.) Vote your conscience, 2.) Do not slander the opponent of the individual you voted for; and 3.) Do not allow voting to disrupt Christian unity. Pastor James and

Bishop Farr call upon all United Methodists in Missouri to engage in political responsibility while adhering to Wesley's guidance.

Small groups open to the entire church:

• Forming Faith (Mondays @8: 00 PM on Zoom): Bible Study for all ages meant for those who are trying to build or better understand a foundation of faith and scriptural literacy.

- **Mountain Service** (Thursdays @7:30PM in Sanctuary): A new service for all people which will now be meeting inside with robust social distancing following CDC guidelines and city ordinances. Please bring a mask!

Vote NO on Amendment 3

Leading up to the 2018 November election, we were part of a coalition that worked successfully to get Amendment 2: Clean Missouri approved by 62% of

Missouri voters. Clean Missouri institutes election reforms, importantly a process by which a non-partisan demographer appointed by the State Auditor, draws up districts, continuing to use the actual number of all residents, but with a focus on fairness, competitiveness, and compactness which are then reviewed by the legislature. As of now, very few districts are competitive, resulting in mostly partisan controlled safe districts, often unrepresentative of the voters who live there.

Amendment 3 would return the redistricting process to partisan control and make drastic changes for drawing districts. Most importantly, it requires that only "registered voters" be counted for apportionment, rather than the current requirement (used by all states) that all residents be counted. Because both suburban and urban areas would be disproportionately affected, once again communities of color especially lose out in representation in the political process. Additionally, citizens could no longer challenge the composition of districts and even judges would be severely restricted in challenging district mapping.

Don't be misled by the opening language relating to lobbyists' gifts and contribution limits. These reductions are minimal compared to the changes already in place from Amendment 2 and serve to obscure the radically undemocratic change in redistricting.

The Justice Team invites you to join us in voting **NO on Amendment 3** and spreading the word.
