

## ...a message from Pastor Sharon

## **Messing with Time**

Advent is upon us...beginning this Sunday, November 29<sup>th</sup>. During the season of Advent, Christians sing songs such as, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" and "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus." These songs anticipate the hope that God's people felt as they waited for their Savior. People of the Christian faith light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, like an emblazoned clock counting down to God's intervention in the world.

The Advent season plays with our notion of time. The church gathers in the present to ponder the past for a future hope. It's a lot like the story, *A Christmas Carol*, a tale in which the past, present and future all come together in one transformative night for old Scrooge. Certainly this story is about love of money, but it is also a story about how Scrooge cannot let go of his past. Early in the story, after establishing that Marley, his business partner, had been dead for some time, Dickens writes, "Scrooge never painted out Old Marley's name. There it stood, years afterwards, above the warehouse door: Scrooge and Marley". Scrooge seems to cling to the past because his (only?) friend Marley represented the only things in which Scrooge trusts: hard work, frugality, unwavering discipline and action that can be weighed, measured and counted.

Jesus came to save us from counting our past as our only reality. It's like when Moses led God's people out of Egyptian slavery into the wilderness. Before they reached the Promised Land, the Book of Exodus describes how the Israelites complained against Moses in the wilderness. They were hungry and tired, and wished they had stayed back in Egypt, even under oppression. Because living in the wilderness was difficult and they were caught wandering between where they were and where they were heading, the people complained and wished they had died as slaves. The people became stubborn and bitter, almost "Scrooge-like" in their relationship with God and one another. Instead of moving forward in faith, trusting that God was with them, the people kept looking over their shoulders, hopelessly lamenting over the way things used to be.

Advent is like living in the wilderness between what was and what will be. We should know something of that wilderness as we approach our 10th month of life within a pandemic. Living into this tension, remembering God's promises, and depending on faith become spiritual disciplines that keep us from turning into

Scrooges ourselves, even though COVID-fatigue has long since set in. While the Promised Land may seem far off, that time when we can go back to work, school, and church fully, without reserve or fear, we must hold tightly to the promises of our God. Scripture declares *"It is the LORD who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed."* (Deuteronomy 31:8)

You will be matched with an appropriate family and notified of your match via an email from. The notification will include information about the family. Please plan to have all gift cards for your adopted family to WRHM by Friday, December 4<sup>th</sup> at noon. Clearly mark a large envelope with your name and the client family's name that contains:

- 1. Gift card(s) for Christmas dinner. The suggested amount is \$25 per person for a family of four + \$20 for any additional family members.
- 2. Gift cards for children/adult's presents enclosed in individual Christmas cards with the recipient's name written on the envelope.
- 3. The form at the bottom of this page for identifying the donor and client family.
