Dear Friends,

This past fall, because it had been such a very different year, we did something very different relating to choosing our 2021 leadership. You see, we had gathered a fantastic team of people for 2020. They were all trained and ready to go. But then along came COVID-19. And we had to send them all home. The work of creating our 125-year Anniversary Celebration and the continued conversations relating to the General Conference's reorganization has had to be postponed to next year.

That's not to say our leaders did nothing from home...but so many of our events, classes, services, and outreach activities that had been planned had to be cancelled. Mostly, our leadership has been engaged in creative planning to carry on the work of the church as best as we could, given our many physical limitations.

For that reason, the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development Team, co-chaired by Lay Leader, Deane Looney and me, have asked the current leadership to give us another year, regardless of when their term expires. Most have agreed, so our 2021 Leadership Roster will look nearly the same as 2020, with just a few exceptions, detailed below. For those who need to step down, we are extraordinarily grateful that you helped us keep the ship upright during these turbulent days. The gifts of all of our leaders have been deeply appreciated.

We give thanks to Debbie Lund for the exemplary job she has done in managing the staff of our church during a pandemic. Her steady and compassionate guidance through the building closure has cast a lifeline to our staff and therefore, our congregation. Debbie will continue to serve the church through musical and other support ministries. Thank you for blessing our church with your gifts of leadership, Debbie!

Debbie's successor will be Roger McCurley. Roger has led our Safety Team the last few years, guiding us through Armed Intruder preparations, the creation of a Safety Manuel, and most recently, providing invaluable support relating to the

appropriate and safest use of our building during a pandemic. We are blessed by Rogers's career experience in management of Human Resources. Thank you, Roger for your gracious gifts of your time and talents!

Tom Pacatte has agreed to step into the chair position of the Safety Team, effective 1/1/2021. Among his many gifts he brings us, Tom's medial expertise has been a valuable resource to our church family for a long time. While serving on the Safety Team, Tom coordinated the acquisition and training for our new automated external defibrillator. Welcome to 2021 Leadership, Tom!

Cindy Foshee has served for the last year as our Chair of Hospitality and Connections. Because of the virus, she has decided that a move is in her future, and must step down from her leadership role. We are grateful for the efforts she has made in her short term, responding immediately with safety supplies to the threat of viral transmission for those who had to be in the church. We will also miss her lovely soprano voice in our Chancel Choir. Cindy's successor to this leadership role has not yet been filled.

I give thanks to all who have served this year in the many ministries of our church, even though your tasks have been dramatically different than you expected. Your work has been vital in continuing to breathe life into our mission. It is my prayer that you will continue to serve, as so many of the leadership has agreed to do, through 2021. Your Team/Committee Chairperson will be contacting you soon.

We are blessed to have such a fine slate of officers and leaders to take us into the uncertain future together. I feel so much confidence in them, and give thanks to God for their willing spirits to join hands and hearts in leading our mission "to make new disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

Sharing Christmas In a Pandemic

Our church will again be sharing our Christmas offering with others. This year, we will be splitting the shared portion with two ministries, Room at the Inn, and InExcelsis.

Our relationship with Room at the Inn (RATI) goes back a long time. Room at the Inn provides immediate, temporary shelter to homeless women and families in the St. Louis region. In addition, they work with them to create an individualized plan back to self-sufficiency, including counseling services and referrals to other human service agencies. Then they mentor them to improve their chances for success.

Our relationship with InExcelsis is brand new. Founded by Severin Pelekara, a member of our church family, InExcelsis reaches out to the homeless, providing support in the way of meals, clothing, bedding, mentoring, and job skill training. The ministry also provides spiritual support through Shared Streets, a weekly worship experience that goes to the people.

2020 has been difficult for everyone, but none more so than those living on the streets, sleeping in cardboard boxes over grates, abandoned buildings, or safe harbors. When you think about your Christmas offering, please imagine their struggles to keep their children warm, fed, and safe during a pandemic. It is the kind of stuff of nightmares. Please give generously.
