## **...a message from Pastor Sharon**

Our Flower Cross is one of the loveliest traditions of our church. The cross is roughhewn, standing 8 or 9 feet tall, covered with chicken wire. Yeah, I know...chicken wire. It's hard to imagine the potential, but just wait and hear me out.

On Good Friday, it would normally be veiled in black, the color of mourning, standing in the center of the nave in the Sanctuary as a stark reminder of the death of Jesus at Golgotha one very bad Friday long ago. It is a witness of our faith, a totem of the gospel story, a sermon about the sin of humanity.

But it doesn't stay empty and forlorn forever.

On Easter morning, everyone coming to our in-person open-air Easter Service will be invited to add a spring flower to our ratty, chicken wire-draped cross. By the time we've all added our flowers, this scratchy, ugly ancient instrument of torture will bloom right before our eyes with delicate new life! And I pray, so will our hearts. That is something to see...and share.

After a year of persistent worry and grief, whom do you know who needs to experience the beauty of new life?

Not everyone has heard the story of the Resurrected Jesus, or heard the promise that God can restore our lives, too. Not everyone has experienced the power stirring within their soul by the ethereal Holy Spirit, who whispers, entices, and invites our hearts to bend toward God. Not everyone has been invited by someone they trust to join the celebration.

Let this be the year that you bring them to witness the blooming cross, and to join in the celebration of new life in the Resurrected Christ!

There will be fellowship with refreshments (also open air) at 10a, and we will safely celebrate the ancient ritual of Holy Communion together, saying those familiar words that draw us closer to God and to each other. Masks are required.

Have to travel Sunday morning? Come to our in-person open-air SonRise Service at Eden Theological Seminary at 6:45a (right off Bompart Ave). We'll celebrate the rising of the sun and the "rising of the Son" with acoustic music and hot beverages. Bring your lawn chair and mask.

This may be the year that your guest experiences an awakening to God working in their life. But if you do not invite them, who will?

**United Methodist Women** invite everyone to join us in donating to our annual **Lenten Mission** observance. This year we come together around the theme ***She Leads: Empowering Women to Make a Difference***. We welcome you to pray, learn, and offer your gifts that will make a real change in the lives of women, children, and youth around the world. This week we highlight two projects funded by United Methodist Women worldwide.

### ***Red Bird Mission***

**Red Bird Mission, in the mountains of southeastern Kentucky,** began as a small school for children in the area in 1921 and shortly thereafter, health care became part of the mission. Currently, the mission operates Red Bird Christian School, Red Bird Clinic, a preschool at two different sites in the county, a clothing & thrift shop, a farmer's market, and services for senior citizens. With this year's donations from UMW, the Mission will seek to re-establish vocational technical education to expand training and workforce-ready certification offerings to Red Bird High School students—helping those whose livelihood was based on fossil fuel production transition to new areas of work, including in the energy sector.

### ***Gum Moon***

Founded in 1868, **Gum Moon Residence Hall & The Asian Women's Resource Center** were established to address the unmet needs of women and children in geographic and social transition. Located in the heart of San Francisco's Chinatown, Gum Moon originally served women & children from the Chinatown community, but has since helped women of all cultural and ethnic backgrounds. Throughout the years, Gum Moon's services & history have adapted to the ever-changing needs of the Asian Immigrant Community of the San Francisco Bay Area. Today, there are women of all backgrounds living in the Residence Hall, where they participate in various programs to learn professional & general life skills.
