...a message from Pastor Sharon

Living in Liminal Time

Our Church Council leadership has embarked on reading a book together entitled "Being the Church in a Post-Pandemic World", by Kay Kotan. I know, we're not in a position to shake the dust of this pandemic off of our feet yet. But, after months and months of uncertainty, we are beginning to see a light at the end of the tunnel, and it feels hopeful. We've just celebrated our return to worship in our sanctuary and small groups will be invited back to the church soon.

The author tells us we are in something called Liminal Time. That's the time between one season ending, (pre-COVID) and a new season beginning (post-

COVID). This time is marked by the disorientation that comes during transitions, like when we've survived a disruption in our life, and we're in that period before major adaptations are implemented as a result.

When my father had a massive heart attack and survived, he and my mother were in that space where they knew they couldn't go back to life as they had lived it, but they needed to listen and learn how to make healthy adaptations that would promote greater life for their future together.

So here we are with an opportunity to be proactive in how we move into a future changed by a year of complete disruption which has necessitated major adaptations to our way of doing and being church.

One of the things we learned this past year is how to create an online worship presence. Not only did it connect us to each other, but other people whom we haven't met yet are viewing too, as silent and anonymous guests. Our mission "to make new disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" calls us to figure out how to help them take next steps in their faith journeys.

Another critical thing we learned this past year is that our grounds offer great opportunities that we had largely neglected in the past. Because we are nestled within a neighborhood rather than on a main street, our Ted Tree out front of the church has become a marvelous connector to our immediate neighborhood, bearing messages, scriptures, invitations, VBS bags, and valentines. Our parking lot, too, is a huge asset we've learned to exploit, hosting worship gatherings, drive-thru children and youth events, celebrations, mission actions, small group studies, and prayer via the stone labyrinth.

Productive Liminal Time is a season of learning and listening, reflecting, and then planning action.

As our leadership continues to learn and reflect together, a new vision of reorientation will surely follow as we discern where God is calling us to point our feet. Please pray for our church leaders as we listen for God's whisperings.

"Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them." (Isaiah 42:9)

Coming Back to In-Building Worship

Here's what you need to know about being a part of the in-building worship experience.

- We will be using a reservation system for those who wish to attend inperson Sunday worship. Currently, we must limit our capacity, so make your reservation between Sunday noon and Friday noon before the Sunday of worship you wish to attend.
- There are three ways to make your reservation:
 - Sign up on our website, <u>websterunitedmethodist.org.</u>
 - Call the Church Office at 314-961-4133 and leave your message.
 - Contact the Secretary at <u>secretary@websterum.org</u>
- The doors to the building will not open until 10am. If you arrive earlier, please wait in your car or outside the building. This is because we are still preparing all the technical aspects of streaming the service online concurrently with our live worship.
- At 10:00am, the doors will swing open and you are invited to enter the building either through the elevator foyer entrance or the upper Bompart entrance (the one with the steps). We will NOT be using the ramp entrance for Sunday worship.
- Please put on your mask.
- Upon entering the building, an Usher/Greeter will escort you to your seat in the sanctuary. It may not be (actually it probably won't be) the seat you usually sit in. Please be flexible with us. We are seating folks from the front to the back systematically in order to reduce unnecessary exposure of passing people in the aisles.
- If you are using the elevator to access the sanctuary, you will be seated in an area that is most convenient to the elevator again after the service concludes.
- Wave your greetings to others, but do not get up and move about the space.
- You may sing, though the hymnals have been removed. You will receive a sheet of lyrics for worship.

- In time, all bulletin information will be projected through Power Point on the wall. For now, just relax and allow us to guide you through the worship experience.
- When passing the peace, you will be invited to nod and wave to others from your seat.
- An Usher/Greeter will release your pew at the end of the worship service, just like at a wedding. Please go when dismissed, rather than waiting to speak with others. Once outside, you can chat with your old friends out on the sidewalk or parking lot.

JUSTICE NOTES: PEACE WITH JUSTICE OFFERING SUNDAY, MAY 30

This offering funds proclamation of the Good News through support of ministries of the General Board of Church and Society (GBSC) and our annual conferences. Two examples: In 2019, the reading mentoring program at Hodgen Elementary in St. Louis (in which several of our members participated as mentors), was supported by a Gateway Central District Social Justice grant made possible by the Peace with Justice Offering. This month the GBSC is supporting May being the Asian American Pacific Island Heritage Month which has touched me and I pray touches you, too.

While living in Tucson, Arizona, I learned from my (Asian American) Bishop Hoshibata that during WW II, a Japanese internment camp was located just southwest of Tucson on Tohono O'Odham Nation land in spite of that nation's opposition to the internment camp. He visited the ruins of that site and thanked Tohono O'Odham leaders for their quite understandable stand against the internment. Bishop Hoshibata was an active leader of Church & Society's General Board.

I was reminded of this piece of my experience reading an email from Susan Henry-Crow, General Secretary of the United Methodist Church's General Board of Church and Society, on May being AAPI Heritage Month. She began by highlighting the diversity and multiple ways these citizens have enriched our churches and community, then moved on to reflect on the sobering reality of historic and recent acts of violence and hatred that have resulted in death and injury of AAIP persons. She quoted the National Federation of Asian American United Methodists: "These acts of hatred are neither sporadic nor haphazard. They reflect a larger systemic trend of anti-Asian American animosity brought on during the COVID-19 pandemic." She commended the U.S. Senate for passing the anti-Asian hate crimes bill by an overwhelming majority of 94-1. This bill seeks to address the drastic increase in hate crimes towards people of Asian descent in the U.S. during the pandemic. She calls us to contact our Representative, urging passage of the COVID-19 Hate Crimes Act. She concluded: "Together, we can bring about a more just and peaceful world where all God's children are valued, safe, and loved."
