Many of our church family have returned to in-building worship. Many have not. Like our recent family reunion, we celebrate with those who are with us, yet miss



Film Screening and Discussion - July 21 at 7 p.m. in Fellowship Hall

The film, “On the Other Side of the Hill”, reminds me of the saying that the grass is greener on the other side of the fence. That’s only true because you aren’t standing on the other side of the fence. Which leads me to the other advice-as-adage: walk a mile in someone else’s shoes and you will think differently about anything. This short (30-minute) documentary will give us a chance to look at the challenges of the climate crisis and how rural Oregon residents are trying to address it.

The film is made available to us by Interfaith Power & Light, an ecumenical faith-based non-profit that seeks to find ways of being good stewards of the planet God created. They write:

The film is a hopeful, inspiring look at local leaders on the ground in rural America who are leading climate action in their communities. But it is also about coming together, finding common ground and new climate frameworks, and shining a light on rural voices as we envision a path forward.

I hope you'll be able to join in the viewing and discussion in Fellowship Hall on Wednesday, July 21, at 7 p.m. We will plan to be socially distanced and unvaccinated persons should wear a mask.
