

Do you remember getting ready for a new school year when you were a kid? Because kids grow like weeds (they say), the "back to school" ritual often involves some clothes in a new size. It probably also includes new undergarments.



Our teenaged friends served by Epworth Children and Family Services are starting school shortly too. One of the greatest needs this year is undergarments (young women's panties and bras, and young men's boxers and boxer/briefs). These gifts will be distributed through all four of the Epworth ministries:

- Transitional Living
- Drop-In Center
- Residential Campus
- Emergency Shelter

New undergarments promote confidence and better personal hygiene. While we may not think twice about ordering or shopping for our own and those for our kids, new undergarments are not often the focus of a clothing drive.

Our church understands the need and we want to help make this a great new school year for teens at risk served by Epworth, our community ministry partner.

August 29th, we will take up an Undies Sunday Special offering. Because sizing can be a crazy challenge, our offering will be a \$\$\$ financial one, to be used by the staff and caregivers of the Epworth Ministries as they assess the needs.

Adam and Eve had to sew together leaves to cover their private parts. That's just not practical anymore. I hope you will participate in our offering for our young friends at Epworth, living and learning in both the St Louis County and City.

Taking Action for God's Creation

As United Methodist Women members, our faith guides us to care for God's creation and the "least of these". Addressing climate justice requires a commitment to 100% renewable energy, clean transportation, and a just transition. It also calls for policies to ensure that marginalized communities are

not negatively impacted by the transition. We need to recognize the disproportionate harm faced by Tribal and Indigenous communities, Black and Brown communities, low-wealth communities, rural communities, and particularly by women within these communities.

We try to make sure we aren't just talking amongst faith groups. We need to connect with environmental justice frontline groups that are directly being impacted. As an act of faith, calling on government representatives to enact legislation can lead to energy delivery that is sustainable and does not disproportionately harm marginalized communities.

Contact your representatives by phone, email, or letter and tell them to enact these targets and strategies for reaching 70% renewable energy by 2030 and 100% by 2050.

- 1. Support only energy sources that are renewable, such as wind or solar.
- 2. Ensure adequate, equitable access to funding and finance for clean renewables.
- 3. Eliminate subsidies for polluting fuels.
- 4. Expand public transportation that is clean, reliable, affordable, and accessible to all.
- 5. Ensure a just transition for impacted workers.

Be a part of the movement to restore God's creation in all its forms.

UPDATE on COVID-19 PROTOCOL

As more of us have become inoculated with one of the COVID-19 vaccines, our community has been opening up quickly this summer. Our church, while staying on the conserving and cautious side, has begun to review our earlier safety protocols, and loosened many of the requirements, as follows:

- Worshippers are welcome to choose their own seats in the sanctuary. The
 ushers are no longer seating and releasing people from the pews.
- We are asking folks entering to maintain appropriate physical distancing, and on exiting, not to congregate in the aisles, but talk outside the building instead.
- Because of the virulence of the Delta variant, and out of a desire to protect others, including children who have not yet been vaccinated, we need to keep our masks on throughout worship.
- Reservations are no longer required. There is room for you!
