Welcome Back to Worship Sunday! September 12th

The leaves are starting to fall from the trees. It's nearly time to turn over the calendar to September, and the students have returned to school. I hate to admit it, and even though the temperatures would challenge it, fall seems to have arrived.

Now it's time to consider returning to Sanctuary Worship, too.

You are right, COVID-19 has not gone away, and the risk of the new Delta variant is still present. But I figure that each of us has our own particular risk assessment

app/program running in our heads. At some point, the risk of gathering physicallydistanced and with masks, may become more acceptable, depending on our personal vulnerabilities. So, I am inviting you to check in with your internal app now and consider coming on September 12th to reconnect with in-person worship.

For your knowledge, our Trustee folks have installed higher efficiency air filters for our worship space, our Safety Team has evaluated every movement in the space in light of the latest medical reports, and during worship, we wave instead of shaking hands, and drop our offering into the basket at the exit door. Once outside the building, many enjoy greeting and catching up with each other.

It was my hope a month ago to invite you to resume your attendance at Sunday school and fellowship time on this homecoming date, as well. But the Delta variant has postponed that possibility. So, for now, the celebration is limited to our worship service, beginning at 10:30a, followed by a light lunch and dessert. There will be options to sit inside, physically distanced, or outside under canopies.

Coming together will offer us opportunity to see our church family again, and be seen. For many, it's been 18 months since you've joined in-person worship. That's a long time to be separated and emotionally distanced. But best of all, it will give each of us a chance to worship physically connected to and part of the body of Christ. There is something about that physical connection that is difficult to articulate, but life-giving to the soul.

We have new members, and guests have resumed coming, so please plan to wear your nametags. I miss you all. I hope to see you soon.

Community Gardening as a Justice Endeavor

Last Sunday, 20 folks gathered after worship in the shade on Fairview for a guided conversation with

Pastor Joshua Krakos on community gardening and an introduction to the community garden our church supports in south St. Louis. Beginning with the big picture and examples in St. Louis, we explored food security/insecurity, the variety of realities that relate to it, such as income, race, access to food, and the umbrella concept of intersectionality (how factors compound each other in lived experience). We moved on to considering how one outcome of urban living can be isolation from the origins of our food, which is something community gardening can address. Other outcomes of this "hands in the dirt" experience is building community, affordable access to fresh healthy foods, and enhanced support for a sustainable environment.

Under Pastor Joshua's leadership young adults and young at heart older adults work a plot at Pennsylvania and Winnebago called "One for the Crow". Some harvested food is left just outside the gate to the garden. A community artist has created a mural of four faces drawn from that community and placed at the outside corner of the garden. We concluded our afternoon with a tour of the garden and the opportunity to harvest and take home herbs, veggies or fruit. It's a work in progress. Taking Action for God's Creation

As United Methodist Women members, our faith guides us to care for God's creation and the "least of these". Addressing climate justice requires a commitment to 100% renewable energy, clean transportation, and just transition. It also calls for policies to ensure that marginalized communities are not negatively impacted by the transition. We need to recognize the disproportionate harm faced by Tribal and Indigenous communities, Black and Brown communities, low-wealth communities, rural communities, and particularly by women within these communities.

We try to make sure we aren't just talking amongst faith groups. We need to connect with environmental justice frontline groups that are directly being

impacted. As an act of faith, calling on government representatives to enact legislation can lead to energy delivery that is sustainable and does not disproportionately harm marginalized communities.

Contact your representatives by phone, email, or letter and tell them to enact these targets and strategies for reaching 70% renewable energy by 2030 and 100% by 2050.

1. Support only energy sources that are renewable, such as wind or solar.

2. Ensure adequate, equitable access to funding and finance for clean renewables.

3. Eliminate subsidies for polluting fuels.

4. Expand public transportation that is clean, reliable, affordable, and accessible to all.

5. Ensure a just transition for impacted workers.

Be a part of the movement to restore God's creation in all its forms.

UPDATE on COVID-19 PROTOCOL

As more of us have become inoculated with one of the COVID-19 vaccines, our community has been opening up quickly this summer. Our church, while staying on the conserving and cautious side, has begun to review our earlier safety protocols, and loosened many of the requirements, as follows:

- Worshippers are welcome to choose their own seats in the sanctuary. The ushers are no longer seating and releasing people from the pews.
- We are asking folks entering to maintain appropriate physical distancing, and on exiting, not to congregate in the aisles, but talk outside the building instead.

- Because of the virulence of the Delta variant, and out of a desire to protect others, including children who have not yet been vaccinated, we need to keep our masks on throughout worship.
