...a message from Pastor Sharon

Showing Up

It's that time of year when your pastor starts talking about stewardship. Many folks would probably have a tough time telling you exactly what that is, but might connect it with their financial pledge to the church. Our financial pledge, our planned giving, is part of that big word, "stewardship." But only one part.

Stewardship is the thoughtful investment or use of money, time, and ability that we offer back to God. In biblical times, a steward supervised a household or an estate. Today, as God's children, we deem God the source of all we have. We seek to hold it in trust for God and desire to be "good stewards of the manifold grace of God." (1 Peter 4:10a)

The five resources that we talk a lot about stewarding in the United Methodist Church are our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. These are the resources we pledge to help support the church when we become a member. These are the resources that those who are not members, but part of our faith family, participate in to the extent that their faith speaks to their hearts. These are the resources that keep the church going.

What we're really talking about here is generosity, one of the fruits of the spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control--Galatians 5:22-3), and it makes my heart warm when I practice it. Generosity is the willingness to give away part of ourselves to others "just because." Just because they need it. Just because we have enough to share. But especially because we follow a poor, itinerant preacher who gave away his life just because of his love for us.

This year, the Stewardship Season begins Sunday, October 3rd, and Pastor Paige is chairing the team. It will run for 3 Sundays, and our theme is about "Showing Up". God "shows up" for us, and we in turn "show up" for others. On Sunday, October 17th, we will celebrate our Commitment Sunday by bringing our pledge cards relating to our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness to the altar during worship.

Medical Equipment Donation Drive for Our Community October 9th, 9 AM through 2 PM

Do you have medical equipment that is not being used? Are you willing to volunteer for the Collection?

St. Louis HELP receives donations of new and used home medical items, refurbishes/cleans the equipment, and then loans equipment to anyone in need for free. They will only accept donations of manual wheelchairs, shower chairs, tub transfer benches, canes/crutches/walkers, Rollators (seated walkers), grab bars, elevated toilet seats, portable commodes, lift chairs, seating cushions/back supports, folding ramps, diapers/ bed pads and Invacare brand-only electric hospital beds. Please donate these items only.

Clean your attic, garage or basement and make a tax-deductible donation of your medical equipment. From Webster UM the closest drop-off location is Webster Groves City Hall (4 East Lockwood 63119). If that is not convenient for you see the webpage <u>www.stlhelp.org</u> for all 7 sites.

They also need volunteers at each site to collect equipment and in Olivette to help unload the trucks. Scheduling is flexible – you can let them know what time you would like to help. Please help them spread the word to your friends.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

As more of us have received one of the COVID-19 vaccines, our community has been opening. Our church, while staying on the cautious side, has begun to review our earlier safety protocols and loosen some of them. The current requirements are:

- Worshippers are welcome to choose their own seats in the sanctuary. The ushers are no longer seating and releasing people from the pews.
- We are asking folks entering to maintain appropriate physical distancing, and on exiting, not to congregate in the aisles, but talk outside the building instead.
- Because of the virulence of the Delta variant, and out of a desire to protect others, including children who have not yet been vaccinated, we need to keep our masks on throughout worship.
