Message from Pastor...

When I was a kid in our little country church, my cousins and I would dress up and we would carpool from farm to farm, with our little UNICEF boxes in hand. We'd ring the doorbell and chime together, "Trick or Treat!" when the neighbor opened their door. Only we were calling for coins to rattle around in our little boxes, rather than candy.

I had a vague notion of what that money would help do in the world. Mostly, I understood that it would help children, just like us, who lived in faraway places and for some reason, not of their own making, or their parents', they didn't get their needs met like we did.

In fact, according to their website, for over 8 decades, the United Nations Emergency Children's Fund (UNICEF) has built



for every child

an unprecedented global support system for the world's children. UNICEF works to deliver the essentials that give every child an equitable chance in life: health care and immunizations, safe water and sanitation, nutrition, education, emergency relief and more. Together, they have saved more children's lives than any other humanitarian organization.

Halloween falls on a Sunday this year. Some years past, we have invited our little children to Trick or Treat for UNICEF from classroom to classroom during the Sunday morning Learning Hour. This year that would be difficult to do since many of our adult Sunday school classes are meeting in cyberspace.

Shae Parsons, our Director of Children's Ministries, will be inviting our children to wear their costumes for Living Stones, and prepare to educate the rest of the church when we leave worship. They will be stationed with their banners and pictures at a table on the parking lot. If you would like to bring a donation for UNICEF to them, they will gladly receive it and tell you about how it will make a difference to other children. "Children helping children," the rallying cry of UNICEF.

This year, the funds raised for the Trick or Treat UNICEF fundraising will be used to support the largest vaccination drive in history. UNICEF is working to deliver 1.4 Billion (that's Billion with a "B") doses of COVID-19 vaccine around the world, along with masks, hygiene supplies, treatments, and diagnostic kits.

I tell you this now, weeks before the event, so you can begin saving your coins (paper money is welcome too) in a jar for Halloween Sunday. Helping to fill our children's buckets will not only provide vaccinations to other children but will empower our children to make a difference in alleviating the suffering of others, and that is a very good thing for them to experience. They have agency in God's world.

Church World Service (CWS) originated the CROP Walk. CWS is an alliance of 37 denominations, including The United Methodist Church, that are committed to working together to transform the world, which means "building a world where there is enough for all" (see www.cwsglobal.org). Currently, CWS is helping to welcome refugees from Afghanistan and to provide them food, shelter, and protection, as well as continuing to respond to the recent earthquake in Haiti.

25% of funds raised by this CROP Walk stays in our local area. Our local partners/beneficiaries this year are Circle of Concern, Webster-Rock Hill Ministries, and the Crisis Food Center in Alton, IL.

The CROP Concert is also the 10th Annual Eden Seminary Festival of Psalms, as well as the final installment of Eden Nights; and for the first time, it will be held outdoors on the Eden field. It features musicians who, in church circles, are locally, nationally, and internationally known (for instance, Richard Bruxvoort Colligan, Christopher Grundy, and Paul Vasile). Food and drink will be available for purchase from Pure Catering, so bring a chair or blanket and enjoy the music!

How the donation & awards process will work:
