a Message from Our Pastor



Dear Church,

As we enter into the season of Advent, and prepare to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child, our country is reeling from prolonged uncertainty and instability brought on by the pandemic. In the United States alone, millions have lost their jobs and are affected by whether or not landlords will evict them from their homes for failure to pay rent. A staggering number of families face food insecurity for the first time in their lives. And those who were already on the brink are even less sure how to survive. We are all exhausted in some way. Even if it is decision-fatigue. We have problems to address. And so did the Holy Family that night.

An oppressive regime had demanded everyone upend their lives and hightail it to their hometowns to register for the census--for tax purposes, likely. Mary was on the verge of giving birth and the AirBnB app just wasn't an option. Whether they got to town late or for some other reason, they had a housing problem that night.

The Innkeeper is a figure of our imaginations. Not referenced in the sacred texts, we assume that since Luke said there was an "inn," then there must have been an "innkeeper." Often our stories cast him in a negative light, someone who banished a pregnant woman to where the animals were kept. But what if, since we are engaging our imaginations anyway, what if he was truly an entrepreneur? Someone who saw a problem and thought, literally, "outside the box" to solve the problem of where Mary could have her child? Instead of thinking "there's nowhere," he said to himself first, "there has to be somewhere."

This begs the questions, could we start thinking outside of the box too? Is there some way to transform our property into a solution for one of our community needs, and strengthen our own viability in the process? Maybe offer affordable office space to nonprofits that work to alleviate societal issues, or create a ministry of care for specially-abled children or adults? Could we expand upon our Room at the Inn ministry, which creates safe temporary shelter for those who are looking to lay their head somewhere, or use our kitchen to feed our urban neighbors? No one church can solve everything but each one can do something, just like the innkeeper. Housing the holy work of Divine Love can happen in many ways. During this Advent -- the four Sundays before Christmas -- invite the Spirit to speak to you about how this church could "House the Holy."

CONFIRMATION



This is a message for Young People, Grades 6-9 (but Adults can read it too) Confirmation begins in January! (Get these dates on your 2022 Calendar)

When you were small, your parents and the church likely made promises on your behalf at your baptism. Now you may be ready to claim the name of "Christian" and take membership vows for yourself.

"Confirmation" is a time set aside for young people, typically grades 6-8, to learn, experience, and explore what they believe and what it means to be a person of faith, and more particularly, to be a part of the Body of Christ at Webster United Methodist. The experience of Confirmation culminates with a special Sunday when you will stand before the church and take your vows of membership, but in your own voice this time.

The Confirmation class will be led by Pastor Sharon and Pastor Paige. Occasionally, Pastor Josh will be able to join us too. We will gather from Noon-2:00 pm on Sundays beginning January 9th, through April 3rd. I'd like to set Confirmation Sunday on April 24th.

Participation is key and the expectations are high. There will be lunch and a 30 minute Parent(s)/Confirmand Orientation Meeting on January 2th, in the Fellowship Hall, beginning at noon. Please be there (and bring a parent or two) if you are seriously ready to explore your faith and your connection to the extraordinary body through which Jesus is transforming the world...the church!

SHOPWITHSCRIPT PROGRAM

As we enter the season of gift giving, I want to highlight our church's participation in the ShopwithScript program. Shop with Scrip is a fundraising program that requires no extra activities. Gift cards are purchased at face value from over 650 retailers, and the church receives a rebate from each card purchased. The rebates vary by retailer and range from 1.5% to 18%. Cards can be used for routine shopping, gift shopping or given as gifts or donations. This is a continuous program, and if there is interest, cards can be ordered on a regular basis. WRHM'S CHRISTMAS ADOPT-A-FAMILY

WRHM's Adopt-A-Family program has announced its Christmas schedule and guidelines for helping families facing financial challenges this year. Deadline for delivery of all donations to the Christmas program is Friday, December 3rd, at noon. Individuals or groups interested in reaching out to an assigned family or families must fill out a donor registration form and return it as soon as possible to 111 East Waymire Ave, Webster Groves, MO 63119 or scan and email it to holidays@wrhm.org. Registration forms are available at church near the elevator entrance, on the Fellowship Hall bulletin board, or near the upper and lower exterior doors facing Bompart Avenue. Registration forms may also be dropped in the mail slot at WRHM offices after hours.

If you prefer to contribute to a combined church donation, rather than to register for the Adopt-A-Family donation, no registration is needed. The church will again collect gift cards and grocery cards in such denominations as you care to give. They will be collected in a designated place in the church office (a box on the desk) or received by the office in the mail.

Suggested guidelines for all donations are: Christmas dinner and gifts, \$25 per person for a family of 4 and an extra \$20 for any additional family members;

For Adopters only: Gift card amounts of your choice (enclosed in individual Christmas cards with the recipient family member's name written on the envelope).

COVID restrictions are still in place, so please limit donations to only grocery store gift cards and regular gift cards. Although this makes the program less personal, it ensures the health and safety of our WRHM clients, volunteers, and donors.

A MESSAGE FROM THE JUSTICE TEAM

The Webster Equity Bridge and the Alliance for Interracial Dignity are sponsoring a community-wide book read of *The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together* by Heather McGhee. Let's dive in together!

This community-wide book study will explore the social and economic costs of racism that all of us pay. Author Heather McGhee shows that racism is the understory of many problems in America, from rising student debt to collapsing infrastructure. She discusses how the false notion of a "zerosum paradigm" has resulted in a mindset among many white Americans that they'll suffer if Black Americans make gains. The book illustrates how this way of thinking has led to negative consequences in education, housing, labor, political representation, and the environment. Ultimately, McGhee makes the case for racial unity, which would result in the enrichment of all Americans.

Organizers are excited about this opportunity for neighbors to work together to build a community of learners interested in nurturing each other's perspectives, growth, and humanity. We will foster constructive conversations with nuance, work to seek multiple viewpoints, and consider the dividends that solidarity can yield. Plan to read from November to January, and then discuss in late January and early February.
