A Message from our Pastor... Honoring the Saints

This year, November 1st was All Saints' Day on the church calendar.

All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, is an ancient Christian celebration in honor of the saints of the church, whether they are known or unknown.

So, what is a saint? In the Catholic tradition, (which was the early and only church) there is a formal process to gain sainthood after death, one which involves a committee examining the body of miracles surrounding that person's life.

Protestants define a saint as a person of exceptional holiness and virtue. Simply put, a saint is a person who walked with God.

The Disciples who spread out all over the Roman Empire carrying the Gospel message became the first saints of the church, for they had walked with God as they hung out with Jesus, traveling the dusty roads together. In the Apostolic tradition, it is upon their shoulders that we stand today.

Later came saints like Martin Luther from the 16th century. His heart burned to serve God. When he saw abuses of power in the church he so loved, he put his career in the church, his reputation, and his life in jeopardy to name them out loud by nailing his list to the front door of the church. Because of his courage and faithfulness, over time the mission of the church was re-focused, re-aligned to serve God by serving people.

A little closer to our own era, we remember the power of a tiny little woman in Calcutta, India who made it onto the cover of *Time* magazine. Mother Theresa become known for her encouragement to "do small things with great love." She

poured out her life for the poorest of the poor. She walked with God by every action of her life.

Yet there are so many saints who have not received that kind of celebrity recognition: people who have lived their lives to carry on the mission of Jesus, simply and honestly; people who have faithfully shown up, spoken up, and stood up; people who have put living for Christ first in their lives, and because they have done so, have changed the world in small but important ways.

Who has changed your life because of their love for Jesus?

We will be celebrating all the saints of our faith in worship this Sunday on November 7th. Come light a candle during worship for those special people who have touched your life and say their name out loud.

Memorial Service


