A Message from Our Pastor

CHICKS, BEES, BUNNIES, & TREES

For many years now, it has been our tradition to share our Easter offering with others as a visible sign of resurrection power. This year, in keeping with our concerns for environmental and climate justice, and in anticipation of several weeks of powerful environmental focus post-Easter, led by our newly formed Creation Care Task Force, we have chosen an environmentally nurturing gift for our offering, Heifer International's Gardener's Gift Basket. A Gardener's Gift Basket features tree seedlings, rabbits, chickens, and a hive of bees as part of an integrated farming approach, along with education in animal care, fertilization, and sustainable growing techniques.

Three important things will happen when a family receives a Gardener's Gift Basket from us: The bunnies will increase garden production by providing compost and fertilizer. The chickens will provide organic pest control as they get rid of bugs and worms, and the bees will pollinate crops for a more abundant harvest.

Malnutrition is a very real problem for families suffering from poverty, one that claims the lives of many children each year. For only \$170 per basket, we can enable families to better support themselves with a healthy, balanced diet. Our plan is to purchase as many Gardener's Gift Baskets as we can to help as many families as we can. Please give generously to our Easter Offering on April 17th.

"My calling is and always has been to work with young people in some way as they discern how to live their faith in their daily lives and, as they grow, what this may look like in their future vocations."





Kady Herr-Yang serves as a certified Hmong medical interpreter for Advocate Aurora Health, providing translation and interpretation services to Hmong patients and staff throughout Wisconsin. "I help eradicate injustice by making sure that family and providers understand that patients have a voice and an opinion about their own health."

LENTEN

Annette Winston, a nurse, reviews applications for the Elderly and Disability Waiver of the Alabama Department of Senior Services, which provides home health services to individuals who would otherwise need longterm care facilities. "I have been a caretaker, advocate, teacher, manager, spiritual advisor and so much more. I believe nursing is a ministry."
