A Message from Our Pastor

NEW OPPORTUNITY TO REIMAGINE OUR FACILITY USE WELCOME NEIGHBOR STL

Saturday, May 21st @ 2:00 pm - 6:00 pm

Since Christmas, we have been working toward hosting a new ministry from our church kitchen: Welcome Neighbor STL, a 501c3 that serves primarily refugee and immigrant families.

Welcome Neighbor hires cooks who have immigrated from other countries (often they bring family members to assist) to create a meal in a host kitchen using recipes from their homeland. It is then boxed up and sold to those who have placed their order (typically \$25-\$30/meal) in advance through the website. The money raised goes to the cooks and WNSTL, and the leftover food goes to the immigrant community. Meals from Syria, Afghanistan, Morocco, Lebanon, Dubai, and Africa have been served. They usually prepare 150 meals to be sold, and they nearly always sell out.

Friends, this opportunity seems like a win-win, in that it provides

- paid jobs for the immigrant cooks and family members
- awareness and a great meal for the consumers
- a meal from "home" for the immigrant community

The church wins, too! By lending our facilities for the experience, we serve as a conduit for local funds to a community with serious needs and provide those who are cooking a forum to use their skills to make money to care for their families. We are using our resources to foster honor and dignity, as well as a delicious meal, for two communities.

This endeavor will take lots of helpers. Volunteers will likely be helping in food prep, kitchen clean-up, boxing the meals, and delivering to the cars as they come through the parking lot to pick up their dinners.

Kris Maly, part of our church family who has also been volunteering over the last year with this organization, has agreed to be the site volunteer supervisor for us.

You can sign up through the blue connection card on Sunday or by contacting Kris directly at <u>kristenmaly@hotmail.com</u>. The operating hours are from 2 – 6 pm, and we typically need 8 helpers. You can volunteer for all or part of a shift.

A CHANCE TO HELP MEND CREATION

The Garden at Eden

Here is an opportunity to see where creation care intersects with service to our neighbors in the greater St. Louis area.

The Garden at Eden Seminary has three primary goals:

- 1. Feeding people with fresh, locally grown produce
- 2. Connecting communities that already work to alleviate hunger
- 3. Teaching others about urban gardening

The Garden, planned and worked by Eden faculty and alumni, needs volunteers to tend the plot on the campus that grows produce for five different local food missions: Centennial Christian Church, Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, the Assisi Houses for people experiencing homelessness, Momma Cat and the Food Bangers, and Isaiah 58. Some of these are straightforward food pantries; others prepare food on a weekly basis to serve those in need.

Beyond tending the garden at Eden (found in the corner of the campus between Bompart and Park by the maintenance sheds), the friends of the garden can also participate in gleaning excursions to farms both near and far. This starts in mid-July. Other members of the team include Peace United Church of Christ and rental residents of the Eden Campus.

Would you like to partner in the "mending of Creation" (words of Letty Russell, feminist theologian)? If so, email Kristen Leslie at <u>kleslie@eden.edu</u> and ask to be added to the Friends of the Garden of Eden mailing list. You'll get information on regular weekly gardening hours and updates about tasks to be completed, gleaning excursions, and seed/produce distribution. When you come, bring a bottle of water, gloves, and clothes that can get dirty. There will be a variety of tasks, some requiring a strong back and others that allow you to sit in a chair. Children are always welcome, as are well-behaved pets.
