PASTOR AWAY

This week, from May 16–20, I will be attending the Festival of Homiletics in Denver, Colorado, nestled in the shadows of the majestic Rocky Mountains. The festival is a gathering of around 2,000 clergy folk who are looking for fresh inspiration and to recharge their spiritual batteries. The week will be filled with amazing preachers, teachers, and musicians. We listen to about 25 hours of sermons and workshops in five days. Perhaps this is not your cup of tea, but for those of us who are used to always "working" in worship, an uninterrupted connection with the Holy Spirit is bliss.

The theme this year is "After the Storm: Preaching and Trauma." The premise is that there is no going back to the life we had before the storm. It certainly looks that way when we see pictures of the neighborhoods on the news after they have been torn asunder by tornados, fires, and hurricanes. It may be hard to imagine that they will ever get their lives back in order, but most do repair or rebuild.


We are still grappling with the collective trauma of living through a pandemic with its many losses, both in human life and in our way of life. There is a heightened sense of uncertainty, isolation, and vulnerability. While the global, national, local, ecclesial, and personal ramifications have not yet been fully realized, we know that how we lived before is not how we live now, nor is it likely to return to the way it was. And while we can always claim that tomorrow is not going to look like yesterday, these changes have been foisted upon us radically and sometimes painfully, instead of through a gradual progression. The result is feelings of trauma. The energy needed to cope with these dramatic changes is further taxed by the heightening concern for the negative effects of global warming, disturbing stories of racial injustice now caught on cameras, and violent political polarization over just about every issue facing our nation.

It's enough to make us shake our heads and feel like we need to lie down for a while. I am eager to learn how other preachers around our country are dealing with these complicated topics from their pulpits.

Thank you, Church, for supporting my continued education.

NEW STUDY FOR KING SUNDAY SCHOOL



These meals present an opportunity for immigrant families to share knowledge and skills that are unique to them. It is also an opportunity for us to get a glimpse into their culture. The fundraising efforts can set them on a path of greater independence and confidence in their lives here in the USA.

Meals are boxed and sold to those who have placed orders in advance through the website. The money raised goes to the cooks and WNSTL, and the leftover food goes to the immigrant community.
