A Message from Our Pastor

HEART MYSTERY

About a year ago this week, on May 23rd, 2021, we hosted our "Welcome Back, Church!" worship service. It was a glorious Sunday, full of God-bumps (they're like goosebumps, only Spirit-prompted), happy eyebrows (remember we were still wearing masks inside), and lots of applause.

Every Sunday since has been a celebration of how glad we are to be in one another's presence again. Now, I'm not knocking attending worship online. In fact, it is a wonderful possibility for those who are unable to join us in person because of illness, travel, distance, or preference. And I give God my undying thanks for the efforts of Gordon Ballam and the online team who have faithfully kept our worship services (both Sundays and Thursdays) available for the electronic community near and far.

But there is something special that happens when we are in a room together physically, as well as spiritually. The sense of being connected is palpable. Even if we are in different places on our spiritual journeys, whether we are present for the first or 500th time, whether we are celebrating or laden with burdens, the sense of being part of a big messy family who laughs and cries together is very real. WE are the church, we the people (not the building), and it is God's Holy Spirit that mysteriously binds our hearts together.

Exactly 284 years ago as of this writing, on May 24th, 1738, John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, wrote in his journal about attending an event at Aldersgate. There he experienced a strange and new feeling-something he had never known before. It was a physical sensation that was so overwhelming that it changed John forever. He felt a strange warming of his heart in response to a reading from the book of Romans. Now, John had been involved with the church his whole life. His father, an Anglican priest in the Church of England, and his mother, a strong, Christian of steadfast faith, had been great influencers of his faith. John studied at Christ Church College in Oxford, and at the age of 25, was ordained as a priest in the Church. But it wasn't until that evening on May 24th that he experienced the power of God's Holy Spirit stirring within him, affirming God's love for him as a beloved child of God, even as a Christian still in the making. In other words, John realized he didn't have to be perfect to be included in God's embrace. God was claiming him just as he was, blessings, blemishes, and all.

I find it most notable that this life-changing event was born not in his prayer closet, but within community. There's just something significant and tangible that happens when we are physically together. Our hearts are strangely woven together in a tapestry of love and care. I cannot explain it very well, but I know it is real. Have you felt it, too?

Every Sunday, as more and more of us are returning to in-building worship, we are again experiencing the thrill of being made more whole. Our guests are experiencing a greater sense of who we are as a faith family, and the Holy Spirit is moving among us, warming our hearts, assuring us that we too belong to God. I hope you will soon join us in this mystery.

HELP SEND COVID VACCINES TO SIMBO ISLAND

Pastor Gideon Tuke traveled 2.5 hours in his "ministry boat," 12.5 hours by sea taxi; 36 hours by plane to travel from Simbo Island in the Solomon Islands to Eden Seminary in Webster Groves, Missouri, to further his education. In the two years he was here he became part of our church family by worshipping with us and participating in Celebrate! and Sunday School. It's hard to imagine living halfway around the world on an island so small it's not on my map – population slightly over 1000 (my high school had 2000). It's easy to believe that Covid vaccines have trouble getting there. On rural Simbo Island, they raise their own food and build leaf houses with natural resources. Usually, their biggest expense is gas for boats to get to larger islands; but now it's paying for face masks, sanitizer, and nurses to come to Simbo Island from urban islands with the free vaccines. Gideon and friends have paid for the first of two shots for half the population, but are now out of resources and need our help. It costs \$1,200 (USA \$) for a medical team to travel to Simbo Island before children return to school in June. Thankfully, it doesn't take 51 hours for our money to reach the Solomon Islands.

APPORTIONMENT UPDATE PART 3



Every year each church is apportioned a fair share of the expenses of the Missouri Conference.

Our share for 2022 is just over \$36,000, about a tenth of our expense budget.

Prior short articles on Apportionments have dealt with "New Generations" (March 3) and "World Service" (March 24). In this piece, we raise up 3 other ministries that our apportionment payments support.

Mission, Service, and Justice Ministries

These funds are used to lead congregations in mission, service and justice ministries including Volunteers in Mission, Mozambique Initiative, and Haiti Water Project as well as disaster response and other outreach opportunities.

Black College Fund

This fund supports 10 black colleges and a medical school that maintain an ongoing relationship with the denomination. It helps to provide well-equipped buildings, solid academic programs, strong faculties, a nurturing environment to encourage students in each new generation, and affirms and celebrates African-American heritage and culture.

Africa University

This United Methodist university is the first non-government institution of higher education in Africa. It serves the entire continent of Africa, by offering post-secondary education for students from all of Africa, specializing in education in schools of agriculture, theology, nursing and management, and business.
