A Message from Our Pastor

WE ARE CONNECTED

First, the background of our church (skip down three paragraphs if you know how we are organized): The United Methodist Church is organized as a global connectional system. That means that all United Methodist Churches are sister churches, like outposts belonging to one central organization, THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH. Every four years, representatives from all over the world gather and make decisions about our doctrine and practices. We call that General Conference.

Also, every four years, Jurisdictional Conference (JC) meets to elect new bishops and appoint them to their conferences. Our own Pastor Josh Krakos serves as one of the Missouri delegates to the JC.

In the United States, the church is further subdivided into 59 geographical conferences. Our church is part of the Missouri Conference, and once a year, all clergy and lay representatives sent by each church gather to refresh our connection, learn about what we are doing all over the world, the country, and the state, and make decisions about programming, spending, and new candidates for ministry. We call this our Annual Conference and Missouri Bishop Robert Farr will preside.

This year, The Missouri Annual Conference will meet June 10-12 in Branson. WUM's representative with voting privileges is Deane Looney, subbing for Paula Murphy whose brother is visiting this weekend from Australia. From our church, Linda Guth Stangl will also be attending, representing the United Women in Faith (UMW) Gateway Central District.

I am a self-professed Annual Conference geek. I am thrilled to join 2000+ voices in worship together. I revel in hearing how our connectional system enables our denomination to be so highly effective in outreach and responsive in mission. And it is always a delight to catch up with colleagues and friends who are serving all over the state. We learn from each other, sharing how we do what we do in ways that inspire others. We spend time together in prayer, in learning sessions, in play, in mission, and in worship. I always return home feeling reinvigorated and proud to be a part of The United Methodist connection. At the end of the Annual Conference, there will be the official Fixing of Appointments, as the Bishop sends the clergy to their new churches. Unless I hear otherwise, I will be delighted to return to you as your pastor for another year.





BRING SOUP ON SUNDAY!

This Sunday, 6/12, our worship will be led by our United Women of Faith (formerly known as United Methodist Women). Our guest preacher will be Rev. Derek Bastian, newly appointed Executive Director of Webster Rock Hill Ministries (WRHM). WRHM is a cooperative effort of member churches (which includes Webster United Methodist) seeking to fulfill their commission to serve people in need in our community. It runs a food pantry and clothing closet, offers prescription drug and utility assistance, provides tutoring and school supplies, and provides a 7-week summer camp for kids ages 5-12. WRHM works to create community by promoting understanding between people and groups. In doing so, it provides opportunities for diverse members of our community to work together across lines of class, age, race, and denomination.

In a recent conversation with Rev. Bastian, I asked about an item that is of greatest demand when our neighbors visit the food pantry. "Soup!" was the answer. This Sunday, please bring cans of soup so we can shower our neighbors being served by Webster Rock Hill Ministries with nutrition.

Juneteenth, or "Freedom Day" is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. This holiday is considered the "longest-running African-American holiday" and has been called "America's second Independence Day." Juneteenth was first celebrated in Texas on June 19, 1866.

It marked the first anniversary of the day that African Americans there first learned of the Emancipation Proclamation, more than two years after it was initially issued.

The City of Webster Groves will be holding a Juneteenth Celebration on June 16th at Barbre Park. Come enjoy the sounds of the Red & Black Brass Band, enjoy light refreshments and see a sign that will be installed celebrating the history of Black businesses in North Webster.
