A Message from Bur Pastor HOT!!!

As I write this, the week promises to be another scorcher. Heat indices are soaring. This is the kind of weather that turns our yards brown and crunchy and drives us inside to airconditioned spaces. It's also the kind of weather that kills.

Did you know that according to NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) nearly 700 people die of heat-related causes every year in the US? What makes this statistic so frustrating is that 100% of them are preventable. Many are the elderly, wrapped in sweaters because of an inability to accurately feel the heat. Others are trying to do without air conditioning because of the high cost of their electric bill.

Then there's the uncountable death toll on animals left without shade or water. The temperature inside of an enclosed car can rise to a deadly level in just minutes after the car is turned off. To leave an animal, or a human, in an enclosed car on a hot day is like shoving them into a hot oven.

As Christians, and as human beings, we must be especially mindful of the well-being of others around us during this heat wave. It's time to check on your neighbor living alone. Maybe walk over and actually ring the doorbell. When the door opens, take note: Does the air that spills out feel cool? Is your neighbor wrapped in three layers of clothes? Is her speech slurred or confused? If so, it's time to get help.

Walking through the parking lot as you head for the store, if you see a child or pet in an enclosed car, call 911. Don't worry about making a big fuss. Just do it. Death by heat exposure is horrible. You can save a life with your quick action. Stand by the car until the authorities arrive. Then your part is done. They will deal with the owner of the car who is sure to be defensive about their action.

By being vigilant and proactive, even though it may feel intrusive, you are "loving your neighbor," and may very well save their life.

If your job requires you to work in this weather, as does my son, who works for the Rock Hill Public Works Department, take frequent breaks in the shade and stay well hydrated. Drape towels dipped in ice water around your neck to keep your core temperature stable. Think about the Arctic tundra.

Since returning in May of 2021, it has been a joy to worship again with the residents of this skilled nursing facility. Because we only provide the half-hour chapel service one Sunday every other month, changes occur. In May we worshipped in the dining hall, but this month we will be back in the chapel.

At 2:00 pm volunteers gather in the chapel on the second floor to receive assignments from Chaplain Michael Tooley and then disperse to floors 1, 2, & 3 to escort residents who use wheelchairs. The half-hour service begins at 2:30.

At BD we have the reputation of singing a lot because we begin singing beforehand. By 3:30 pm we have finished returning residents to their rooms.
