### A Message from Bur Pastor

#### VOTING FROM A CHRISTIAN PERSPECTIVE

(From Ministry Matters, an online newsletter)

"Over the next week, all Christians who are registered to vote in the United States would do well to keep in mind this nugget of wisdom from John Wesley that has been making the rounds on the Internet:

'I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them,

- 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy;
- 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against; And,
- 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.'

A lot of quotes attributed to Wesley do not actually originate with the 18th-century Anglican preacher and founder of the Methodist movement. But this one does. Wesley wrote it in his journal on October 6, 1774 in reference to the British Parliamentary elections held in the fall of that year.

With Wesley's quote in mind, here are a few ways you can prepare for the next season of elections:

- Spend time in prayer, not only reflecting on whom you should vote for but also asking God to guide your words, attitudes, and actions toward those with whom you disagree.
- Reflect on the candidates you will be voting for. Are these candidates 'most worthy?' If so, why? How has your faith informed your decisions?
- Think about the candidates you won't be voting for. Reflect on these candidates' good qualities and reasons why other people consider them 'most worthy.' Don't assume the worst about opposing candidates and their supporters.
- Resist any urges to write nasty, anonymous comments about opposing candidates on the Internet. And, if your candidate loses, don't write ridiculous things like, 'This is the end of America as we know it' or accuse the winning party of cheating.

- Pray for the well-being of the nation and the world, regardless of which candidates emerge victorious.
- Remember that your president, governor, senator, congressperson, state
  representatives, etc. represent you, regardless of whether you voted for them. Let these
  people know what issues matter to you and why. Work with these elected officials for
  the benefit of all people, and particularly those whom Jesus called the 'least of these.'"

Now, this is me talking (Pastor Sharon). The bottom line is that Jesus was not a Democrat, and he was not a Republican. Jesus was all about relationships. Jesus had the interests of others at the top of his priorities. Jesus was about integrity and justice. And Jesus was about healing. If your candidate is not voted into office, or (most especially) if (s)he is, practice graciousness.

Remember that there will most likely be a need for healing. Invite Christ to initiate that healing, and be a part of it as well.

#### THANK YOU TO ALL WHO DONATED ITEMS FOR UKRAINE!


The final tally of donations is:

# SAFE GATHERINGS TRAINING (FORMERLY KNOWN AS SAFE SANCTUARY)

### JULY 31ST @ 11:35 AM IN FELLOWSHIP HALL FOR 45 MINUTES

Greetings church family,

It is that time of the year again when we need to hold our yearly Safe Gatherings training. This is how we ensure that we provide our children, youth, and vulnerable adults a safe environment to Love, Grow, and Learn with Christ. This training is required for anyone who helps with any of our volunteer projects. This includes nearly all of our congregation at one time or another during the year. All church members are encouraged to join in this training. The more adults who are trained, the safer our environment.

During the Safe Sanctuary orientation meeting, you will be:

- Provided copies of and helped to understand Webster UM's "Policy and Guidelines Aimed at Keeping Safe our Children, Youth, and Vulnerable Adults"
- Educated about the problem of child abuse
- Informed of Missouri's laws for reporting child abuse and the appropriate steps to report an incident of child abuse

You will be required to complete:

- The "Volunteer Commitment Form." We need your social security number to complete the background screening.
- A "Worker Registration Form" to be filed with Missouri's Family Care Safety Registry. (Note: If you are already registered, this form will not be required. Those who were trained last year have already completed this form.)
