A Message from Our Pastor

Dear Church,

The bad news: an unusual and wonderful opportunity has arisen, and Hannah Dippel, our Communications and Administration Coordinator, will be moving to Columbia at the beginning of July, which is good news for her, but made me a little sick inside when she shared the news.

The good news: Staff Parish Relations Committee has agreed to a proposal to continue employing Hannah as our Communications and Administration Coordinator. She will work remotely and has agreed to come back to Webster Groves for scheduled gatherings as necessary. She will continue her two main ministry purposes from the job description, as follows:

- Facilitate marketing and internal and external communications and
- Coordinate general business operations through Office Volunteer Staff

In addition, we are merging many of the tasks originally assigned to the Social Media Intern into Hannah's position. It just makes a lot of sense for Hannah to be creating the imagery that is then shared on all print and social media, rather than dividing it between two persons.

Most of Hannah's direct responsibilities under these three major purposes will be done remotely from Columbia, or anywhere, as most of them are now but some will need to be adjusted. To that end, several of us gathered together to review the two job descriptions. There are some things that Hannah will need to completely shift to Office Volunteer Staff, like printing and retrieving/distributing phone messages. We will be doing some training for those who need it. For most of the church, who rarely, if ever, met with Hannah, they will not perceive any change. The rest of us will be using text, phone, and email to stay connected and delegate assignments.

We have shifted the hours for the church office to 9:00 am - 12:00 pm (instead of from 9 am - 3:00 pm).

We are so grateful for the time and energy of our Volunteer Office Staff. They welcome guests at the door and on the phone, do light office work, bring in the mail, ready the sanctuary for worship, and handle occasional mailings. We can always use another welcoming spirit, especially during summer travels. Since returning in May of 2021, it has been a joy to worship again with the residents of this skilled nursing facility. Because we only provide the half-hour chapel service one Sunday every other month, changes occur. In May we worshipped in the dining hall, but this month we will be back in the chapel.

At 2:00 pm volunteers gather in the chapel on the second floor to receive assignments from Chaplain Michael Tooley and then disperse to floors 1, 2, & 3 to escort residents who use wheelchairs. The half-hour service begins at 2:30.

At BD we have the reputation of singing a lot because we begin singing beforehand. By 3:30 pm we have finished returning residents to their rooms.
