a Message from Our Assistant Pastor

A REFLECTION ON THE 2022 UMC JURISDICTIONAL CONFERENCE

Dear Church.

John Wesley wrote that conferencing is a method of grace. When I was elected by the Missouri Annual Conference in 2019 to be a voting delegate in the Juristional Conference, I was hesitant about this. Now, I couldn't agree more.

From November 1st-November 5th I was in Houston, TX at the South Central Jurisdictional Conference. The Annual Conferences that make up that delegation are Arkansas, North Texas, Central Texas, Rio Texas, Texas, Northwest Texas, Louisiana, Great Plains, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Oklahoma Indian Missionary, and of course the great Annual Conference of Missouri. During these packed five days, our job as a voting body was to put new petitions and resolutions forward, approve a series of reports from the quadrennium (which is now six years because of COVID-19), and most importantly elect three new bishops for the jurisdiction. Also, a number of smaller committees met to discuss drawing lines of annual conferences, appointing bishops, etc.

Over the last three years, the Missouri delegation has been meeting monthly (except during the height of the pandemic) and engaging spiritually about how best to carry out this ministry through conferencing. One of the things important to note about this delegation is that over 50% of us were new to this role. This means that new eyes and ears will be brought to the work of this legislative body. Considering all of this, we made history in a number of ways. Our main job as a jurisdiction was to elect three bishops to replace the three bishops who were retiring. The process for the election of bishops gives each voting delegate three votes per ballot. Now, that might seem like a lot, but every ordained elder in the jurisdiction is eligible to vote for bishops. Only 60% of the entire body of the jurisdiction is required to elect a bishop, but it sometimes takes several rounds of voting to achieve that number. In the first ballot, we elected all three bishops! This has never been done in United Methodist history. Not only did we elect all three bishops on the first ballot, but we elected the first Black woman in the jurisdiction and the first Native American Bishop in the United Methodist Church!

All three of the bishops are highly qualified and are great leaders for the future of our church. I am inspired for the future of the United Methodist Church, and I can't be prouder to call myself a United Methodist right now. We are making great strides in our church for the betterment of all people, but especially those who have been disenfranchised by the church in the past. In particular, all three Bishops are LGBTQIA+ affirming clergy and support a change in the Book of Discipline regarding same-sex marriage and openly LGBTQIA+ clergy.

To share what I have learned, I am leading a small group on Tuesdays in the month of November from 6:30-7:30 pm, in person (Space Room) and via Zoom. Please contact me if you would like the Zoom link. I hope to see you there! My heart is so incredibly full. I am thankful for the blessing it has been to represent you and the Missouri conference at the jurisdiction, and I look forward to sharing what I can with you. WEBSTER-ROCK HILL MINISTRIES' CHRISTMAS ADOPT-A-FAMILY PROGRAM

For many years, individuals and groups within our church have participated in the Adopt-A-Family programs at Webster-Rock Hill Ministries (WRHM). It is now two weeks past the application deadline for personal contact at Christmas with a participating family. Late application may be possible by calling WRHM's office at 314–961–5082 and identifying yourself or your group as coming from Webster United Methodist.

Alternatively, individuals or groups may participate by direct donation in the form of gift cards or checks made out to Webster-Rock Hill Ministries with "donation for Adopt-A-Family" written on the check's memo line. Online donations are also possible on the homepage of WRHM's website, <u>www.wrhm.org/holiday-programs</u>.

Mailing either gift cards or checks can be risky, so hand delivery to WRHM's office (111 East Waymire Ave., Webster Groves) is recommended. The office is open daily from 9 am until noon. There is usually ample parking on the street or in WRHM's lot. Suggested guidelines for giving include \$25 per person for a holiday meal plus \$25 per person for each individual Christmas gift. Hello everyone!


