a Message from Our Pastor

DOES GOD HAVE A FARM?

"When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest. Leave them for the poor and the alien. I am the LORD your God."

Leviticus 23:22

In the 1970s, Paula and Dale Dill were our Mission Committee co-chairs. Paula hailed from a country church where planting an acre of their land dedicated to the church was commonplace. Each fall, after harvest, the soybeans or wheat would be sold and the proceeds donated to the church coffers. After a bit, these folks began gathering each fall with the goodness from their gardens too, plus pies, baked goods, and home-spun treasures. They invited the community to a homemade dinner of chicken and dumplings and the Lord's Acre Event was born! Paula brought that idea to our church and since then we've been hosting a similar event every year. All proceeds go to local ministries offering care to others as well as to our sister church in Mozambique.

These events herald back to the Biblical tradition established in Leviticus to leave a portion of the harvest from the vineyard and the field for the poor. And no, God doesn't really have a farm. Though, as God created everything that was and is, one might argue that every drop of water, grain of sand, and ounce of dust does indeed belong to God. The Lord's Acre Event, our "harvest offering", will be this Saturday, November 5th at 5:00 pm. The evening will include a supper of homemade chili recipes and all the fixins, an auction (of homemade goodies and goods, including pies, muffins, candies, jam, baby blankets, and quilts), a silent auction (involving stealth and quick action), and a country store where you can buy something that you fancy.

Tickets are still available (\$15 for adults and \$5 for youth) and can be reserved through the church office, purchased online by clicking <u>here</u>, or purchased the night of the event in Fellowship Hall.
