A Message from Our Pastor

WELCOME NEIGHBOR STL DRIVE-THRU SUPPER & FOOD DRIVE FOR WEBSTER ROCK HILL MINISTRIES Dear Church.

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was an American Baptist minister and activist who became the most visible spokesman and leader in the American civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. King advanced civil rights through nonviolence and civil disobedience, inspired by his Christian faith and the nonviolent activism of Mahatma Gandhi.

King participated in and led marches for Blacks' right to vote, desegregation, labor rights, and other basic civil rights. King led the 1955 Montgomery bus boycott and later became the first president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. King helped organize some of the nonviolent 1963 protests in Birmingham, Alabama. He helped organize the 1963 March on Washington, where he delivered his "I Have a Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.

Through his courage, his words, and even his death, King ignited a movement that is still necessary as our country continues to deny civil rights to all of its citizens. This weekend, our country will celebrate the life and justice work of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In the past, members of our church have helped lead a communitywide celebration including a march from City Hall, a soup dinner with homemade cookies, and a program filled with music, essay awards, and a keynote speaker. However, the pandemic has forced a change in this practice and for the third year, we will carry out community service instead. Instead, we are going to serve our community intentionally during the month of January, beginning with hosting the Welcome Neighbor STL dinner on Saturday, January 14th. WNSTL is a non-profit organization that employs immigrants to create meals from their native country using their mother's and grandmother's recipes. The meal creates opportunities to share their culture with their new neighbors while raising funds toward greater independence for their families and communities. Only 150 meals will be prepared, and you must pre-order online to be assured of your meal. **You can order now by clicking <u>HERE</u>** and enjoy the delicious cuisine of Africa after picking up your meal between 5 and 6 pm in the drive-through in the parking lot.

Friends, food insecurity seems like an unlikely condition in what some perceive to be a fairly affluent community like Webster Groves. However, statistics tell us that it is prevalent, especially among families of color and our aging neighbors. For those whose families have called this town home for generations, it is becoming more and more difficult to live here, meet the rising taxes, and/or raise a family. In the spirit of MLK, can we help?



Look for a parking lot tent on weekends, or the big green collection unit on the lot next to the elevator entrance for easy drive-by drop-off. As you shop for your contribution, think of aging folks and some of their special needs and families with growing children. They are our neighbors. Stocking their pantry is a good way to tell them they are loved. It's a great way to drive out the darkness of poverty, depression, and hunger. As Christians, we celebrate that the Light of the World has come. Let's share some light.
