A message from Pastor Sharon...

Waves

Recently, Joel and I were blessed to walk on the shoreline of the Gulf Coast. The water and air temperatures were nippy, so we did not jump in. But the warm sunshine made the cool water and mushy sand under our bare feet feel pretty good for a February.

Relating to the waves can be a spiritual experience. I pondered this as my senses were filled to overflowing, as I drank in the beauty of the many aqua blues and rich purples, the scent of the sea air, and the sounds of the gulls swirling all about us. The enormous breadth of the ocean waters inspired me with a sense of majesty of our Creator. I was reminded who God is, brilliant Author and Creator of all things that are, and who I am, God's child, the benefactor of God's love and grace.

Joel and I watched with amusement as the delicate little sandpipers chased after the waves to capture something that was tumbling in the ocean's white froth. But once successful, they scurried back to a safe distance before the next wave washed in. Again and again, they chased after the waves, but withdrew in just the nick of time.



How like them we can be, hailing God's attention as we would a taxicab, calling for God to fix our lives, or provide what we want, or change the outcome. But when we get what we're after, do we scurry away to a safe distance, running far enough away from the intimacy of God's presence that we won't get our feet wet, but still close enough to be able to call upon God again when there is another need?

Intimacy thrives when there is presence. That's not to say that we cannot stay close to someone special in a long-distance relationship, but it takes a lot of work. When we stay close to God, allow the waves of God's presence to lap across our feet, and even succumb to fully immerse ourselves in God's embrace, we can know a far deeper filling of God's Spirit than if we stay safely on the sand dunes of the shore watching.

This Lenten season, I invite you to take off your shoes and socks and let your feet get wet. Walk with Jesus through prayer, study, worship, giving, and service. Let God's Spirit wash you clean, heal you, and fill you.
