Faith Climate Action Week, April 14-23

Earth Day is Saturday, and our church is shining a light on climate concerns and action all this week. Christians should concern ourselves with the preservation and nurture of our planet. According to Genesis 2, God created this marvelous garden, and then commissioned humanity as the gardening staff. Sadly, we have not done a very good job. On balance, we are failing, and the consequences have been staggeringly destructive.

Much scientific evidence has been shared about the cost of our persistent dependence on burning fossil fuels to energize our way of life. As Earth's climate has continued to warm because of our use of carbon-emitting fuels, a new pattern of more frequent and more intense weather events has unfolded around the world.

Global warming contributes to the intensity of heat waves by increasing the chances of very hot days and nights. Warming air boosts evaporation, which can worsen drought. More drought creates dry fields and forests that are prone to catching fire, and increasing temperatures mean a longer wildfire season, and the loss of critical trees that act as natural air filters in our environment. Global warming increases water vapor in the atmosphere, which can lead to more frequent heavy rains and snowstorms. A warmer and moister atmosphere over the oceans has produced more and stronger hurricanes, producing greater rainfall, and resulting in more destructive flooding.

Our weather has gone haywire, and humanity is chiefly responsible. It stands to reason that it will take a unified effort to change its trajectory. In an effort to build consensus and community, and ultimately action, all across the nation, people of all faiths have been invited to join their voices together to pray for action on climate change on Earth Day, Saturday April 22, at noon.

I challenge us all to stop what we are doing on Saturday at Noon and pray this prayer. Let it sink in and change us.

New Paschal Candle



On Easter Sunday we welcomed our new Paschal Candle to the chancel in the sanctuary! The Paschal Candle (also known as the Christ Candle) is the large white candle that is meant to be first lit by the acolyte bringing in the light of Christ, and then the last extinguished, as the acolyte symbolically takes the Light of Christ out into the world. We light our candle during our Sunday worship services and other special services, including Celebrations of Life as a bright

reminder of Christ's presence with us. Our last Paschal candle burned for eleven years and will now serve as the center of our Advent Wreath.
