A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

The Hate Grows

As long as I have been living, there has been unrest in the Middle East, those lands between southwest Asia and northern Africa, stretching from the Mediterranean to Pakistan. Actually, tempers have run hot there for many, many generations, dating back to the biblical stories of the Old Testament. For many people of faith, these lands are sacred, the home of their ancient and revered fathers and mothers.

War has been declared by Israel in response to the Hamas attacks on October 7th, which killed 1400 people in Israel. It resulted in 199 hostages, including women and children. Hamas, a militant fundamentalist organization, known officially as the Islamic Resistance Movement, governs the Gaza Strip of the Palestinian territories. The Israeli response has been decisive resulting in over 2300 Palestinian deaths, and now tens of thousands of Palestinian civilians are in need of food, water, fuel, and medical supplies. A humanitarian crisis is developing quickly.


It is challenging for me to understand all this hatred from people of deep faith, who love and worship the same God as I do. I doubt that I am alone in my alarm and confusion. As Jesus is my guide to the heart of God, I am reminded that he got pretty angry at the Temple when he saw the moneychangers taking advantage of the faithful. So mad in fact, that he threw over their tables, sending the coins rolling everywhere. But when Peter later cut off the ear of one of the Roman soldiers who had come to arrest Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus stopped Peter and rebuked him. It seems that Jesus, and by extension, God, can feel righteous indignation, but is not about killing to resolve conflict.

The United Methodist Council of Bishops (COB) issued a statement last week condemning the violence in the Middle East and calling for prayer and action. COB President Thomas J. Bickerton urged all United Methodists to renew a deepened commitment to pray for those on both sides of the conflict who have been injured, abducted, or killed; and to deepen our prayers for those who have suddenly lost a loved one.

Innocent blood continues to be spilled. Suffering and tears continue to flow. People of faith continue to bury their loved ones and grieve their losses. Hate continues to grow. I believe our shared Parent also grieves that God's children continue to hurt one another so grievously.

Let us pray fervently for a peaceful resolution.
