

Webster Groves High School sophomore Samantha Enlund has been working on a project to End Racially Restrictive Covenants on property deeds in Webster Groves. She is supported by the STL Changemakers at the Missouri History Museum, the Chelsea Center of WGHS, and the City of Webster Groves.

Send your home address to Samantha at <u>sjenlund2008@gmail.com</u> and she will personally check if your home has a racially restrictive covenant. You can also check for yourself by following the instructions on the <u>City of Webster Groves website</u>. This City page also has background on the issue and guidance on how to disavow/release the covenant.

The City is maintaining a registry of citizens who take action to get rid of a racially restrictive covenant. This is an opportunity for each person to "acknowledge our history and make our community more welcoming to all."


LITURGICAL COMPOSERS CONCERT
