#### New Small Group Experience: Adult Faith Tour, April 12-13

As do all Protestant faiths, The United Methodist Church stands on the shoulders of our ancient Jewish and Catholic mothers and fathers of faith. It has been our practice during Confirmation for our youngsters to visit different houses of worship to experience the traditions of these major world religions. This year, I am opening it up to adults who are interested in joining us.

Jesus was a Jew, raised in the Temple in Jerusalem and knowledgeable of the scriptures in the Torah. So it makes sense that we begin our exploration with the Jewish faith. Friday evening, **April 12th, we will celebrate Shabbat Shalom worship at the Shaare Emeth Temple, located at 11645 Ladue Road, 63141**. Worship begins at 6:00pm. After the service, we will be joined by a docent who will give us a tour and answer our many questions. She will unroll one of their sacred scrolls, and allow us to view the hand lettered work written in Hebrew.

If you remember church history, the one and only church, the Catholic Church, split during the Great Schism, of 1054 into the Roman Catholic Church centered in Rome, and the Eastern Orthodox Church, of Constantinople.

On Saturday morning, April 13th, we will visit The Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, located at 4431 Lindell Blvd, 63108, and participate in 8:00am Mass. After worship, we will take a self-guided tour to study the beauty of the mosaics that cover the walls and ceilings, get a close up view of the many small chapels and the magnificent altar. Our confirmands are always interested in learning about what happens in the darkness of the confessional.

Finally, at 10:30am, we will tour the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church, located at 4967 Forest Park Ave. 63108, to learn about their traditions, some familiar, and many very different. Father Michael will be our host.

We will lunch in the Central West End, to share our reflections and compare and contrast our experiences with our own worship at Webster United Methodist. Confirmands will be with Amanda Furbee, Director of Children and Youth Ministries, and me. Adults will join together at other tables and be on their own. We are generally back at the church by 2pm.

Studying other faiths helps us understand our own so much better, and gives us a deeper appreciation of our connectedness. Sign up to join this excursion on the Blue Connection Card at church.


