# Professions of Faith

As babies, many of us were baptized in church. As part of that service, our parents made public professions of faith on our behalf. The church made promises too, to love us and pray for us; to model what it looks like to follow Christ.

As a young person reaching the age of accountability, the church then offered them the opportunity to take more responsibility for their own faith. Many young people then engaged in the spiritual journey of Confirmation.

Confirmation is a series of experiences that includes classroom presentations, study, prayer, and activities, concluding with the determination of readiness and desire for membership. It is a call to discipleship; a call to claim the name "Christian" for themselves. The journey culminates when a person stands before their church and commits to love and serve Christ with their lives.

This coming Sunday, May 5, 2024, the church will celebrate five young people who have concluded their Confirmation journeys and made the decision to become full members of Webster United Methodist. They will make their profession of faith in Jesus as their Lord and Savior, and then take their vows to support the church, the body of Christ, with their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.


A celebration with refreshments will follow the worship service in our Fellowship Hall. There will also be baskets for your cards, gifts, and/or notes of encouragement and congratulations.




The program will feature two women from **Voices of American HERstory** to help us learn more about Sojourner Truth.


# THE KING CLASS HAS STARTED A NEW BOOK ON SUNDAY, APRIL 28
