

Chapel at Bethesda Dilworth, Sunday, July 21

Every other month volunteers from WUM provide a thirty-minute worship service for the residents of skilled nursing facility Bethesda Dilworth (9645 Big Bend Road in Kirkwood). At 2:00pm volunteers gather in the chapel on the second floor to receive assignments from Chaplain Michael Tooley, and then disperse to floors 1, 2, & 3 to escort residents who use wheelchairs and wish to attend. The half-hour service begins at

2:30pm. At BD we have the reputation of singing a lot because we begin singing beforehand. By 3:30 pm we have finished returning residents to their rooms.
