LETTER FROM THE CHAIR OF CHURCH COUNCIL

Dear Church Family,

I hope this message finds you well. I wanted to update you on recent Church Council activities and decisions. Apologies for the delay in communication, and thank you for your patience.

In our May meeting, we addressed an important administrative task: updating the list of authorized signers for our church accounts. We found that some individuals listed had passed away or moved, so we have now appointed new signers for the Trustees account, Pinnacle account, Memorial Wills and Legacies Fund, and the operating account at PNC Bank.

During our July 9th meeting, Sky Krakos and Pastor Glen shared insights from the annual conference. The conference continues to grow and remains financially strong, which opens up new opportunities for Webster United Methodist. We learned that grant funding may be available for local congregation initiatives. While we did not discuss specific grant opportunities at this meeting, we are excited about the potential and plan to explore this further.

We also received updates from our finance team and trustees. Stan Reichert reported that renovations to the church parsonage are progressing well. Many in our congregation have generously contributed both time and resources to support this project. Although the renovations have been costly, your special donations have been crucial in advancing the work.

The finance report also indicated potential challenges ahead, but it is encouraging to see how our community has previously come together to address financial difficulties. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

Our next Church Council meeting will be on Tuesday, August 20th. I look forward to keeping you informed and working together on our upcoming initiatives.


