Dear Friends

I would like to thank you for your financial support this year. I am happy to report our giving is on track to meet the expected levels of giving forecast in our budget. Your generous support allows us to continue to make a difference in the lives of our faith community, in the lives of the community in which we live, and in the world around us.

Thank you for your support during this year of transition. We welcomed new staff members, a new Director for Children's and Youth Ministries, Amanda Furbee, and our new pastor, Rev. Glen Connoley. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped in the transitional period. The much-needed renovation of the parsonage was met with overwhelming support from volunteers, both through their work and financial contributions. And our programs and ministries continued with enthusiasm and success.

As I look to 2025, we need to continue building on the energy within our faith community.

The Gratitude and Generosity Giving Program is the time when we ask our faith family to prayerfully consider their financial commitment to the church for the upcoming year.

For John Wesley, giving was a means of expressing generosity rooted in gratitude for God's generosity and a means of fulfilling the great commandment to love God and neighbor.

As Christians we are invited to share in God's divine life and mission of giving.

Our goal this year is to have returned commitment cards representing 110 individuals (adults, youth, and children) and to raise our level of giving by 10%. Both are significant increases over the previous year.

There are several reasons for a 10% increase in giving. Most importantly, we need to compensate our employees fairly and to invest in our future if we are to grow our faith community and expand services to our communities. Secondly, we lost a significant amount of rental income when we transitioned the parsonage from a rental to the home for Pastor Glen and his family. And thirdly, as with all organizations, our operational expenses continue to increase.

As I write this letter, I am confident we can achieve both these goals in the next 30 days. Please prayerfully consider how you might pledge your support next year. If you are able, please join my wife Joan and me by increasing your giving so our church family can meet our goals.

CALL TO ACTION FOR RAISE THE WAGE/EARNED PAID LEAVE: ON THE NOVEMBER 5 BALLOT as PROPOSITION A.

Last year we joined the Healthy Family Initiative Campaign in collecting signatures from registered voters to be able to vote to change Missouri law:

- to increase the minimum wage to \$15 per hour in increments over 2025 & 2026 and thereafter adjusting it based on changes in the Consumer Price Index beginning in 2027.
- to require employers to provide one hour of paid sick leave for every thirty hours worked up to a total of 40 hours.
- to provide oversight and enforcement by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.
- exempted are governmental entities, political subdivisions, school districts and education institutions.

Look how the church is being a good steward of our planet!

In an effort to reduce our energy consumption as well as the waste we produce, the Trustees of the church have been making changes over the years to the church facility. Look what they've done for us and the planet:

- replaced worn-out systems with higher efficiency systems (A/C)
- replaced old toilets with low-water flush toilets (remodeled men's room off Fellowship Hall)
- replaced all light bulbs with LED light bulbs (which produce less heat and use much less energy
- installed "bypass ballast" bulbs (thus keeping the old ballast for the fluorescent bulbs out of landfills)
- installed programmable thermostats that automatically reset after overrides (so that when spaces are not in use, we are not unnecessarily heating/cooling them)
- installed motion sensors for lights wherever possible (so that lights turn themselves off when spaces are unused)
- installed motion sensor faucets (women's restroom off Fellowship Hall) so that water doesn't run after the user is finished

Additionally, the church

- recycles paper, aluminum cans and items not sold at the rummage sale
- recycles scrap metal, electronics and motors
- reuses plastic containers
- recycled old fluorescent lightbulbs as recommended
- plants native pollinator-friendly plants on the grounds (with more to come!)

Every effort, no matter how small, contributes to the health of our planet!
