

### CALL TO ACTION FOR RAISE THE WAGE/EARNED PAID LEAVE: ON THE NOVEMBER 5 BALLOT as PROPOSITION A.


Last year we joined the Healthy Family Initiative Campaign in collecting signatures from registered voters to be able to vote to change Missouri law:

- to increase the minimum wage to \$15 per hour in increments over 2025 & 2026 and thereafter adjusting it based on changes in the Consumer Price Index beginning in 2027.
- to require employers to provide one hour of paid sick leave for every thirty hours worked up to a total of 40 hours.
- to provide oversight and enforcement by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.
- exempted are governmental entities, political subdivisions, school districts and education institutions.

#### Our next steps:

- Register to vote by October 9 and encourage others to register to vote.
- Vote Yes on Proposition A.





**World Communion Sunday** is a denomination-wide celebration emphasizing the value of education and training. We commemorate this day on October 6th by giving generously to support young adults and make a global impact for Christ.

- **Fifty percent** of the funds collected on World Communion Sunday are used for scholarships that benefit undergraduate or graduate level students of color pursuing ordained ministry.
- Thirty-five percent of the funds collected provide grants to support training for worldwide inclusion, diversity, equity, and access. In-Service Training Grants are designed to bolster recruitment, training, and retention of persons of color for leadership positions at every level of the church and its ministry.
- **Fifteen percent** of the funds are used for leadership development among our partner churches and communities in Africa, Asia/Pacific, Latin America, Eastern Europe, and people from communities of color in the U.S.

Together, we can achieve much more than we could alone. Your generosity reflects God's glory through young leaders, equipping them to pursue God's call in their lives.
