

FINANCIAL UPDATE

As we near the end of 2024, Webster United Methodist has been blessed with strong financial support for which we should all be thankful.

Our Gratitude and Generosity Giving Program also showed strong financial support. We are waiting for just a few more Commitment Cards. If you haven't had a chance to complete a card, we ask you to prayerfully consider beginning or renewing your commitment by completing a commitment card. To date we have received commitments from 76 adult givers and 9 youth and children givers for a total of \$289,761. We are excited to report that over 70% of givers increased their financial commitment.

With all the financial success in 2024, we unfortunately incurred several large and extraordinary expenses. The cost of renovating the parsonage exceeded our projections, even with donations supporting those renovations. We also had higher than expected costs in other areas. While we projected our expenses to slightly exceed our income, the higher than projected expense will cause our deficit to exceed \$20,000 without additional support.

We understand that most families are unable to give more than they already have. Money is tight. Especially this time of year. If however, you have the resources we ask that you prayerfully consider giving an 'extra mile" to improve our finances. If you are able to give, please designate your giving for the "Extra Mile" or select "Extra Mile" in Online Giving.
