A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Matthew 26:40-41 ceb

40 He came back to the disciples and found them sleeping. He said to Peter, "Couldn't you stay alert one hour with me? **41** Stay alert and pray so that you won't give in to temptation. The spirit is eager, but the flesh is weak."

Greetings, siblings in Christ!

This coming Sunday, March 9th, we will start our Lenten study at 9am in Fellowship Hall. (Reminder, don't forget to set your clocks forward one hour Saturday night, so that you won't be late.) Lent is a church season structured around Jesus' great commitment to fulfill God's purpose in the world (i.e.: to die and rise again). We, as Jesus' followers, can likewise use this season to challenge and recommit ourselves to fulfill God's purpose for us in this world.

I invite you to take some time in prayer and to think about how you might recommit yourself to your discipleship journey over the next six weeks. Also, read the introduction and chapter 1 of *The Final Days* by Matt Rawle. Come prepared Sunday morning to look at the gospels, specifically Jesus' full commitment to God, to the point of death on a cross, and how you might mirror such faithfulness (even if not to the same extent) in your own life.

Also, remember, the start of a new series is always a good time to invite someone to join you at church, and Lent is a great season for a newcomer to learn what we (believers) are all about. Hope to see you and a guest on Sunday!
