If you are unaware, we are in the season I mentioned a few months ago, where we are beginning a shift in our communications as a church. You will hear the name Subsplash, the company that hosts our new communications platform, in the coming weeks and months. The goal is to make this platform our all-in-one church management system. That means it will host our giving, our membership, and our communications. Some of you will soon be contacted about the change in our online giving platform. Over the next 50 days, those who give online will need to transition to the new Subsplash giving program. This is a very simple process and more information and instructions will be provided next week.

Right now, we are working on building a phone app and a new website for our church. Eventually, we will move our member's data information to this platform as well.

As you hear more and more about this, I want to remind you of what I promised when I mentioned this about four months ago: 1) we will move into this change together; 2) this is a necessary improvement to our systems, so that we are better equipped to move into the future; and 3) this change is every bit as much about the folks who have not yet become a part of Webster, as it is about the folks who are already here. I promise, there will be numerous post-worship sessions to help anyone and everyone better understand this new system and what it means for you. In the meantime, Gordon Ballam or I will be happy to answer any initial questions or concerns you may have.

If you know one of those people who "have not yet become part of Webster," this Sunday is the perfect time to invite them to worship, especially if they LOVE hymns. I hope to see you all there.

## UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH THE CANAANITE WOMAN'S FAITH

A REPORT FROM RESPONSE MAGAZINE JULY/AUGUST 2025

The Bible study in this issue is from Matthew 15. A Canaanite woman shouts to Jesus for him to heal her daughter. The disciples say, "Send her away." After three tries, Jesus answers her. "Great is your faith. Let it be done!" She dares to believe he can do what she's heard he can do, and her daughter is healed. Even though she is a Gentile, she calls Jesus "Lord" and "Son of David".

The Response article gives an example with a modern version of this persistence. In 2017, Senator Elizabeth Warren gave a speech quoting Coretta Scott King and was interrupted three times (which is against Senate rules). In a way, they were saying "send her away" as in the Bible verse.

Moral: Be annoying. Be someone who can hear God's voice. Watch your life change, and watch the world transform.
